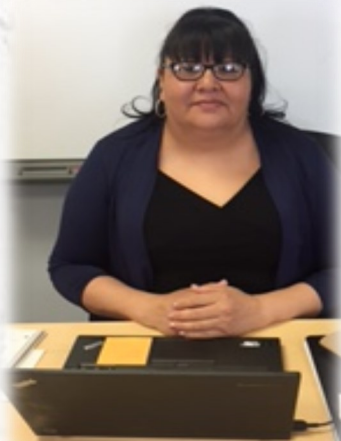
The Siksika App is being used in the classroom to show the student how to utilize the abundance of information that has been put into this app.

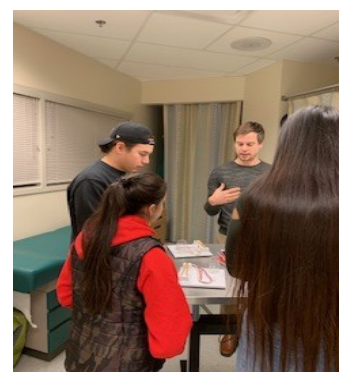

Tannis' Update

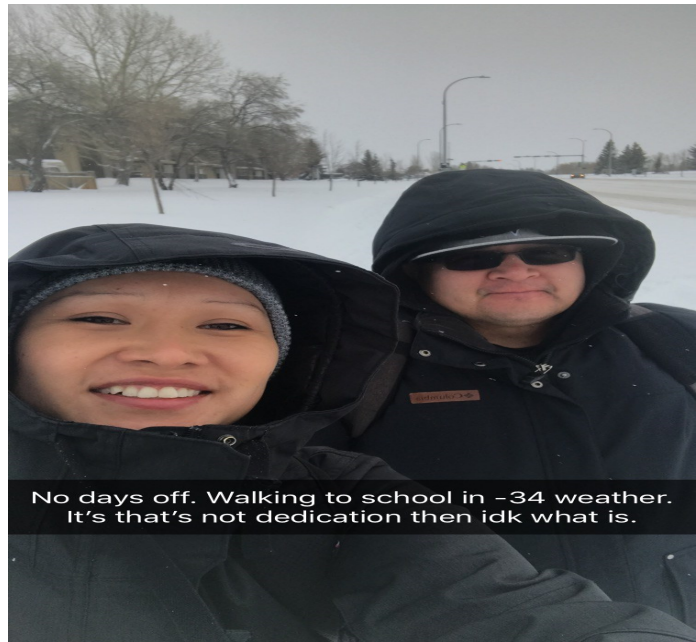
Oki everyone,

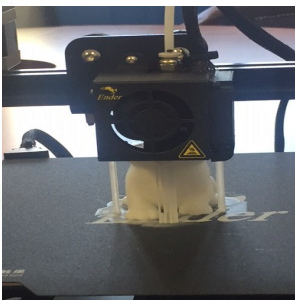

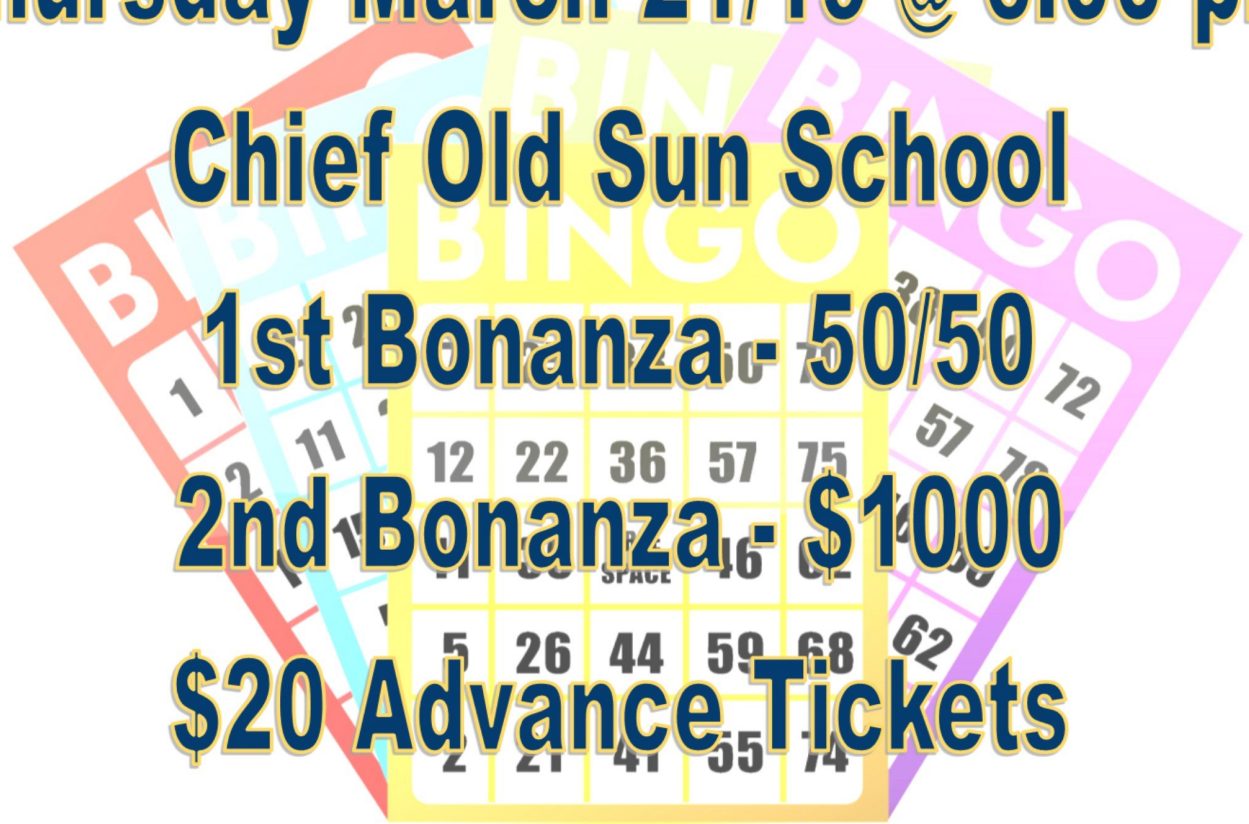
