GFWC History Snapshot

Ever wonder how the GFWC community service programs got started? The Public Issues Community Service Project grew out of the American Citizenship Department established in 1920, when clubwomen were working toward the elimination of racial and religious discrimination. Since 1950, with the official establishment of the Public Affairs Department, clubwomen have addressed such issues as health care for veterans, the eight-hour workday, and child labor laws. Through the years, clubwomen's concerns about crime, safety, and voter awareness have been reflected in a variety of programs, including a longstanding emphasis on traffic and highway safety programs.



As early as 1894, club projects expanded educational opportunities for women and their communities. Clubwomen supported legislation to improve school

conditions and to create compulsory attendance laws and, in 1904, helped to establish the US Department of Education. GFWC is credited (by the American Library Association) with establishing 75% of the public libraries in the US and developing kindergartens in public schools.
