Pastor's Article for February

The Epiphany season is a long one this year! We have a long stretch of seven Sundays between Christmas and Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of Lent.

Like many pastors, I have a file full of newsletter ideas related to Christmas, and plenty that have to do with Lent. Epiphany, however, is another story. Once we get past the Magi worshipping the infant Jesus, the boy Jesus in the Temple and the Baptism of Jesus at the Jordan, I am stuck! How can we view Epiphany itself as a gift?

Perhaps, after all the rush and hubbub leading up to Christmas we can use some time to pursue the journey of discipleship and prepare for Lenten devotion. That can happen in our lives as individuals and as a congregation. Some suggestions:

- 1) Take a journey through some book of the Bible. One of the Gospels, yes. But perhaps a letter of Paul or even one of the Old Testament books you have not checked out in a while. Bask in the Word of God.
- 2) Worship. One of the pastors at text study group where we were considering Luke 4: 14 21, pointed out that the text states "And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read." We gloss over this so often and yet, here is our Lord, spotless and sinless Lamb of God and his life was built around regular worship. We should not be tempted to skip worship simply because it is not one of the high seasons of the year. Our Epiphany journey, like the entire Christian life, is built around worship of the Lord and regular participation in the Eucharist.
- 3) Engage in devotional reading. Find a good book on Christian themes and spend some time in it. You can grab one of the devotional booklets available at church and use it as a daily stimulus. We always seem to have extras!
- 4) Reach out to do something for someone else. Charity work abounds at the holiday season. How about extending that urge to works of goodwill into February (and beyond)?

These are just a few suggestions, but I urge you, above all else, to be alert to signs of God's presence and work in this world and in our lives. That is what "epiphany" means – a dawning, or a new awareness of something that is occurring --- and we need to be aware of God's presence in our world. This season of darkness and dormancy leads to the renewal and new life of Spring. It is coming!

Plan to join us for the start of Lent at Prince of Peace on Wednesday, March 6, at 7 p.m. As we begin the Lenten journey of repentance and devotion, we meet the Communion table and hear the call to seek God's will for us.
