“Going On To Perfection”

I once knew a young man in another Christian denomination that experienced a call on his life to become a pastor. After expressing this calling to his pastor and allowing his pastor and local deacon board to examine him, he was ordained in that church a few months later. In not so similar fashion, I answered a call to ordained ministry in the United Methodist Church late in my senior year of college. Little did I know that ordination in the UMC would require me to earn a bachelor's degree, followed by a master's degree in seminary, years of candidacy studies, meetings with mentors and accountability groups, Board of Ordained Ministry interviews with extensive doctrinal paper writings (twice), and a three year provisional period. All in all, it took me nine years to become an ordained minister from the time I began the process. There were times when I wanted to give up and I wondered if I had misunderstood God's call on my life. Needless to say, I don't think I would have made it through the process without my loving and committed wife, a supportive extended family, and several good ministry friends. Because the process was so long and involved, I sometimes mistakenly thought that getting ordained was the ultimate goal. After accomplishing that goal I soon realized that process was really a time of preparation, testing, and trial for more to come in the life of a Christ follower called to be a minister.

The year I was ordained as an Elder in the United Methodist Church, my ordination class was brought before the clergy of the North Georgia Annual Conference for approval. The Bishop questioned us from a list of questions asked by John Wesley. Two of those questions are as follows: “Are you going on to perfection?” and “Do you expect to be made perfect in love in this life?” Since I had just completed my board interviews to be recommended for ordination, it was hard for me to think that I would be going on to perfection in anything. Then I remembered the story of the Israelites and their journey out of slavery in Egypt that took them into the wilderness for the next 40 years. The goal was the Promised Land, but the journey would be a time of preparation, testing, and trial for this nation called forth by God to be His chosen people to bring salvation into the world. The perfection God calls us to become is that of love which is in Him, by Him, and through Him. This kind of perfection is not something we do, but something we receive and become. Ephesians 2:8-9 says, “For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast.”

What about you? Does life feel like a series of tests and trials? You are not alone. In fact, you have more opportunity than you realize to receive grace from God through Jesus Christ. He gives us power through the Holy Spirit to go on to perfection in His love. Take time this summer to allow God to enter into every part of your life and truly be your Savior and Redeemer. By God's grace we can be made perfect in love in this life and become what Christ proclaims in Matthew 5:48 when He says, “Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.”

Can we upgrade or update the facility and our activities to be more appealing to the younger retirees that are moving to the area?





In the beginning, God... Interested in learning more about Genesis? These titles and others are available in the HUMC library:

Genesis 1-11 by John MacArthur (Bible Study). An in-depth look at the creation story, the first murder, Noah and the Flood, the first covenant, the Tower of Babel, and the dispersion of the nations.

Creation, Fall, Restoration: a Biblical Theology of Creation, by Andrew S. Kulikovskiy. (Bible Study) The author takes us into the territories of scientific and biblical interpretation, and the changing views of nature in the history of both these areas.

Coming to Grips with Genesis: Biblical Authority and the Age of the Earth, ed. by Terry Mortenson and Thane Ury. (Bible Study) Fourteen theological scholars address key topics related to the age of the earth. This is the crucial issue of debate in the church today regarding origins.

Please check out your book or movie and leave the card, found in the back of the book or movie, in the box in the library on the shelf near the return box. This gives us an opportunity to find out what is being used and we can send you a gentle reminder if you have forgotten to return a book or movie.

From Our Lay Leader: Dale Gardner



In the past two issues of Mountain Messenger I wrote about the spiritual significance of numbers in the Bible. This month I want to continue this discussion on the number **three** (including third, trinity, etc.). The biblical number three pictures completeness. It is also the first of 4 spiritually perfect numbers. The others are 7, 10 and 12 and I'll cover them in the next few months. Probably the most spiritual representation of the number three is the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Trinity is introduced to us in the very beginning text of the Bible - God (the creator), Son (the Word) and the Spirit of God (the Comforter/Advocate).

As spiritually significant as the Trinity is, the number three is significant in other ways. Three is mentioned over 450 times in the Bible. Consider the following: 3 righteous patriarchs before the flood (Abel, Enoch, Noah); 3 righteous fathers after the flood (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, who was later named Israel); 3 to the third power is 27 which is the number of books in the New Testament; 3 times Jesus prayed in the garden before his arrest; Jesus was placed on the cross on the third hour of the day (9am); He died at the ninth hour (3pm); 3 is the number for the resurrection (Jesus dead 3 days and 3 nights); 3 men witnessed the transfiguration (Peter, James, John); 3 people were allowed to ask God anything: Solomon (1 Kings 3:5); Ahaz (Isaiah 7:11), and Jesus Christ (Psalm 2:9). God gave Israel 3 gifts (His law, the land of their inheritance, and their calling); The Bible names 3 angels (Michael, Gabriel and Lucifer). There are 3 places where sexual sins are specifically referenced (Romans 1:20-32) homosexuality and overall sexual immorality, (1 Corin. 5:1-13) the church allowing a member to commit incest, (Rev. 2:19-25) a woman in Thyatira teaching believers to commit sexual immorality and spiritual adultery; 3 seasons of God's festivals: Spring - Passover, Summer - Pentecost, and fall (Trumpets, Atonement and Tabernacles).

These example only scratch the surface of the number of times three is referenced. What I found most interesting is the fact the Trinity is introduced in Genesis - the beginning book of the Bible and that 3 is also prominent in the Book of Revelation the last book of the Bible. In particular; an angel cries 3 woes (8:13); two witnesses are not allowed to be buried but lie openly for 3 days; 3 unclean spirits will be allowed to deceive the world to fight Jesus in the battle of Armageddon (16:13-16) and New Jerusalem will have 3 gates on each side for a total of 12 (21:13) which is also one of the spiritually perfect numbers.

Perhaps, the most powerful spiritual statement involving three is found in Revelation 1:8, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End who is and who was and who is to come.

On the Lighter Side ...

Living in a different culture most certainly brings its challenges! And as we all know, life itself can just be downright hard sometimes. This month's update is a bit on the lighter side, because quite frankly I just needed to laugh. I am learning to laugh at myself — trying to speak the languages (there are at least 4 spoken on a daily basis here) and trying to “blend in” in a place where that is simply impossible. It really is quite comical! So here are some funnies and some things that might give you a new perspective from my last few years here in Uganda—ENJOY!

One of the youth came and shared with me how his father had him move out of the house (not uncommon at his age, it is time for him to live on his own). He said he had nowhere to go and had been sleeping on the floor of a local saloon. Well this Mama's heart thought—he cannot live in a saloon, it is not safe. He will have to wait until late at night for everyone who is there drinking to leave and there will be drunks, fights, etc. Where will he study? I thought, I must go immediately and investigate. So I went to town to see about this. The young man met me and we walked to where he was staying. We finally stopped and he pointed out where he was sleeping—a hair “saloon” (salon). Words are different here!



Hungry?? Ever thought of walking in to your back yard, taking a stick and throwing it up into a mango tree (or any tree with fruit), waiting for the fruit to fall, bending down to pick it up and eating it? The thought never crosses my mind, you? The kiddos and locals do it every single day while the mangos are in season. They use the resources God gives them for their daily provision.



How about countless times showing up late, early, or others being really late or really early. I thought I was doing really good learning my numbers and counting to ten. But then I realized hours/time are different here. For example, I would show up at 2:00pm instead of 8:00am. Why?? Time here is counted by the number of hours past sunrise (usually around 6am). For example their time “2” is for us 8am. They call it 2, 2 hours past sunrise. Another why?? Most don't have a watch—they use the sun. What time is it anyways??


Being in a different world is humbling to say the least, but it is so much fun!



Jail/Prison MinistryElaine McEver



Good News: Ms. Elaine's House is getting a new House Mother. Diann Hall is a referral from Christ the King Church. She has a BA in Behavioral Services, 15 years experience with Department of Family and Children Services, 4 years experience with Well Spring Living as Life Coach, and is a devout Christian. She is planning to move in on July 1, 2017. The other news is that Pastor Mike Stewart, from Ministries of Grace, will be returning to the Executive board of Almost There, Inc. At one of our early meetings he had a vision of houses like ours popping up all over Georgia and the US.

As I saw the long list of pastors who will be retiring this year from North Georgia UMC, I remembered a former pastor saying that you could never retire from ministry. Then as he was spending his last days in a nursing home with Alzheimer, the story was told that he would be preaching one minute and swearing the next. Makes me wonder about myself. My mind and body tells me that it is almost that time. My heart and love for the Lord and hurting sisters in Christ continues to cry out for mercy for them. For many years I have lived Jail/Prison Ministry. I have been at Ms. Elaine's House in Hiawassee for 8 months with girls who have chosen Enotah Drug Court as an alternative to prison. Three women have been living with me. Two followed the rules with many rewards from Judge Gunter for going beyond their requirements. One woman is now waiting to transition from Union County Jail to Prison for being AWOL and refusing a drug screen. One was told by the court that if she had her own place, she could get her little girl out of foster care. We helped find her an apartment and with assistance from thrift stores, The Women's Enrichment Center, and private donations collected clothes for a 4 year old.

Even as I write this article, things continue to change. Because of appointments Ms. Diann will not officially start until August 1 so I will be at Ms. Elaine's House for a few more weeks and she will be helping out until then. I also love and appreciate HUMC. Thank you for your support as we continue to help women who have been caught up in the criminal justice system.


