

The Beginning

It was February, 1978 and 67 women gathered for a Pot-Luck lunch at the original Bar K Ranch house which has since been replaced. There is no mention of the weather, or the menu ... we are left to imagine a particularly cold Texas February; the chilly air warmed by the enthusiastic energy of pro-active women determined to get something meaningful done.

The founder of the Lago Vista Women's Club, Ann Murrow recently explained, "In 1978 there were about 200 full time residents in Lago Vista and only two active organizations—the Bridge Club and the Women's Golf Association. I had an active competition going on with myself as to whether I was worse at Bridge or at Golf! I needed something to do!"

The Women's Golf Association held regular meetings with their members and once a month they extended an invitation to non-golfers to attend one of their business meetings. This planted the seed for what has developed into our amazingly active and dedicated Women's Club. "Today's Mission Statement is the original, worked on, revised and reviewed with determination and dedication by

Ruby Nunn. I later learned that her father owned the shoe store where my parents used to purchase my shoes as a child! It is a small world!", Ann went on to explain.

From its inception, the Lago Vista Women's Club has been dedicated to two main things—serving the community and building the community. The first year there were four fund raising activities and the tradition of funding scholarships for young ladies graduating from Lago Vista High School was born. This tradition will see its 40th iteration in January of 2018 as we produce, once again the formidable Gala which raises funds for our Philanthropic Committee.

Through the years we have collectively raised over \$400,000 which is donated to the young graduates in the form of scholarships or to local organizations and charities. 100% of the funds we collect benefit our local communities and we are proud, as well we should be, to lift our heads and say we are members of The Lago Vista Women's Club, "Spread Your Wings and Fly"

Who We Support

Our Community Grant Recipients

Every year a group of members gathers to study the grant requests we receive from organizations that are active in our community. Their duty is to determine the eligibility of each of the requests and to determine how to allocate the available funds. This section of our newsletter is meant to provide a brief description of those YOU are helping to support. All the funds we collect throughout the year, particularly through our Gala, are destined for Scholarships and Grants; usually in a 60%-40% split. We will present the charities in alphabetical order throughout the year.



Friends of Balcones encourage the preservation of the Refuge's critical habitat through educational tours, exhibits, and

activities which provide an opportunity to experience the animals, plants and habitats of the Texas Hill Country. They serve in a cooperative relationship with The Refuge providing funds, volunteer labor, and in-kind Resources. The Refuge is a bird sanctuary and the public has the opportunity to be involved in their conservation effort. They state that they envision:

- ... a world in which people, plants and animals live in harmony.
- ... a world in which the practice of green living comes naturally.
- ... a world in which ecosystems around the world are protected for future

generations.

The Women's Club donation was used to reprint their ***Kid's Guide to Hill Country Critters***; an 8 page informational booklet with central Texas animals and birds, and how to identify them.



Friends of Nameless School

In the 1860s, settlers began homesteading the western north shore of the Colorado River. By 1870, they had established a school on the banks of Cross Creek (now Big Sandy) which they called Fairview. This one-room School was active from 1870-1945. The present building was constructed in 1909. It is located about 1.5 mile off FM 1431 on Nameless Rd.

In 1880, Fairview became the community of Nameless.



After the U.S. Postal System had rejected six submitted names for the community, the residents responded, "Let the community be nameless and be damned!" The implied name was accepted.

With the permission of the Travis County Commissioners Court, the members of the Lake Travis Extension Education Association, now known as the *Friends of Nameless School*, have held weekly quilting sessions and monthly meetings in the school for the last 50 years. In 2000, it became apparent that the school needed a major restoration. After years of fundraising and grant seeking, the group raised the funds necessary and restoration of the school was accomplished in time for its centennial celebration in 2009.

The *Friends of Nameless School* encourages local groups to use the facility. School groups and scouts appreciate participating in a one-room school house experience. All the original desks are still in use. The *FONS* raises money for the school's upkeep through quilt raffles and the sale of their crafts. In addition, they hold a barbecue at the school every other year in the springtime for the community.

The Lago Vista Women's Club Grant to Nameless School in 2017 is greatly appreciated and has been used to build a much-needed concrete ramp from the driveway to the newly purchased storage building. Nameless School, a gem of area history, shows the importance placed on religion, education, friends, family, and hard work by our area's early settlers. It continues to be a gathering place for present residents and for those who will come to this area in the future.

Hill Country Busy Bees-Is a brand new 501 (c) 3 nonprofit organization founded by OUR founder, Ann Murrow dedicated to propagating Mason Bees; important pollinators that neither sting nor create hives or honey. They are solitary bees and lay their eggs in "nests" that consist of long, hollow tubes. **The Hill Country Busy Bees** help furnish appropriate nurseries or bee houses that can be placed in one's garden or backyard to provide these important insects with a place to "raise their young'un's", provide important educational printed materials on



the importance of bees to our communities and furnish speakers and presentations to local organizations willing to participate in helping to increase the population of Mason Bees. At the luncheon the Hill Country Bees will have a limited supply of custom made Mason Bee Nurseries available for purchase and orders will be taken for additional nurseries. Each nursery is being handmade by a local woodworker and can be ordered in pine or cedar. Please look for the special display table at our October and November luncheons.
