

THE REST OF THE STORY-LAGO VISTA WOMENS CLUB History of Gala from 1999 Submitted by Annette Stokes

The very first Women's Club Gala Gordon and I attended was in March of 1999, having joined the club in September of 1998. We enjoyed a meal catered by *Thirsty Turtle*, I believe, served on long tables at **Bar K Clubhouse**. There were no reserved seats, just long tables. It was here that we met David and June Freeman. June and I have been gala attendees (and women's club workers) together ever since!

Bar K at that time had a small stage in its main room, and the performers were Women's Club members who presented a mixture of song and dance, comedy skits, in costume. The Director was Vince and two performers I recall were Madeline McFarlin and Bette Burton.

There was a silent auction – small as I recall – and I won a Bud Boleman painting!

We lost the *Thirsty Turtle* as they went out of business, and we decided to create an elegant dinner ourselves. I don't recall the names of the recipes, but I do know we were to prepare for 20 people each; casseroles and desserts. And though we all had the same recipes to follow, the results were all different! Our husbands were the waiters and servers that year. We had purchased our own place settings thru donations, but guess who had to wash dishes when it was over?!

We worked all day to prepare, we served, entertained, cleared tables, and washed dishes, and took out the garbage! Out of our finery into tennis shoes. *A grand change was hiring a real caterer!*

In 2001 the Spring Gala was held in March at K Oaks, the new clubhouse! There was no theme other than "Spring Gala" until 2009, when Jean Andrews was 3rd Vice President and she changed the name to Winter Festival because we changed the date to January 30. The Executive Committee decided it seemed wise to move the date to January because we had become competitors for money raising with the Seton Gala. Themes varied from *Wild Kingdom* in January 2010, to

Voyage of Titanic, to *Wizard of Oz, Those were the Days*, and *A Night with Studebakers*. Each year was an exciting change! Donna Nash came aboard to help steer the decorating themes. Fantastic!

Until January 2009 and the Gala date change, no luncheon meeting was held in March, but plans for the Gala were paramount. However, we had to meet in January to promote ticket sales so close to Christmas. It turned out to be a good decision as January was a dull time of year, and people were glad to support us.

<u>And the biggest change</u>: the lure of the information about raising money for charities came in July 2010.

Then Liz Hagler, 3rd Vice President, and I, President, discovered Gayle Stallings, a professional fund raiser. She met with Liz and me for a whole day at **K Oaks**, observing our situation, absorbing our goals and the means of our fundraising story. She gave this day *gratis*! Raising money is her expertise and she tried to explain to us the ins and outs of successful ventures. She could promise 50% more dollars! She sold us on Paddles Up! But of all changes, **it was a scary time! Would this go over with Lago Vista?**

I called an emergency Executive Committee meeting in July. Gayle convinced the group that we could do it better! In September 2010, Sheryl Speckman, Teresa Simon, and some others attended a Gayle Stallings workshop to learn the how to's. It was well worth the monies spent to send them, to learn new methods, new ideas.

We became a 501c3 organization in 2005. I suspect we are among the top in philanthropic giving of all the North Shore clubs.
