





Who We Support

Our Community Grant Recipients

Every year, a group of our members gathers to study the grant requests we receive from organizations that are active in our community. Their duty is to determine the eligibility of each of the requests and to determine how to allocate the available funds. This section of our newsletter is meant to provide a brief description of those YOU are helping to support. All the funds we collect throughout the year, particularly through our Gala, are destined for Scholarships and Grants; usually in a 60%-40% split.



The Lago Vista Players conduct a youth workshop each summer which provides between 20 to 30 children quality theatre arts instruction and an opportunity to perform a

play. Many of the children have gone on to perform with the LVHS theatre groups and LV Players major shows.

The children's tuition for this workshop is kept very affordable to ensure all interested children have the opportunity to attend. Unfortunately the cost of renting K-Oaks and paying the director's honorarium significantly exceed the tuition money we collect. Each year the Players must augment the tuition with approximately \$1,000 of other revenue to cover all provide a needed expenses. The generous donation from the Lago Vista Women's club goes directly to support this youth program. It would be difficult to keep the cost to the children's families so low without the help of the Women's club

The Lago Vista Public Library

Part of the mission of the Lago Vista Public Library is to enrich the quality of life for all citizens of the community by providing access to recreational reading, information and lifelong learning opportunities. The Lago Vista Women's Club has been instrumental in helping the Library toward that mission. In previous years, grant funds were used to purchase books and audiobooks for the library, which were very popular with residents that like to listen to the spoken word, and especially to the people who listen to books on their commutes to work or on vacation road trips. Last year's grant funds allowed us to purchase four new laptops and software for the Library to ales and sort water for the chord of the control of

use for computer literacy. The Library and the Women's Club formed a special partnership to offer free computer classes to the public. Club members, Anna Johndrow, Karen Parker, and Klee Lee instruct students in the use of Microsoft Word, Excel and Publisher. Library Volunteer, Mike Valls teaches classes on cyber security and Internet Safety. The Library provides the Meeting Room space and offers use of the laptops to students who don't have one of their own. Library staff and volunteers are grateful to the Women's Club for its generosity and for

helping the library service to the community.
