(cont) Wilder from a major children's book award, over concerns about how the author portrayed African Americans and Native Americans, and that the board of the Association for Library Service to Children (ALSC) made the unanimous decision to change the name of the award at a meeting in New Orleans. So, the name of the prize was changed from the *Laura Ingalls Wilder Medal* to the

Children's Literature Legacy Award. (Not sure what they were drinking down there in New Orleans but had to be something potent). ALSC said Wilder "includes expressions of stereotypical attitudes inconsistent with ALSC's core values". The award was given to Wilder in 1954. The ALSC said Wilder's work continued to be published (thank the good Lord) and read but her "legacy is complex" and not universally embraced".

After I picked my jaw up off the floor, I saw Melissa Francis in an interview on the TV about her new book *Lessons From the Prairie*. That's where I first learned the she was a child actress and played Cassandra Cooper Ingalls in the *Little House on the Prairie* television series. So, that's the background on my choice for a book review this month. Now and then, a gift just gets handed to you. The book is funny, serious, and inspiring with her insights into the world she entered when she was only 8 years old. I will review the book and give some information on the destruction of some really happy memories from many different childhoods. Hope many of you can come and remember with me all those stories that have been well loved down through the years. I will even try to be even-handed in talking of the reasons all this happened.
