

# Reincarnations

Spirits reincarnate and maintain a certain inner pattern of behavior. Philosophers, scientists, religious, military, artists, progress in each existence and acquire new knowledge.

The Spiritist literature describes several cases of reincarnations of spirits who stood out for their selfless lives, or who had a positive transformation.

**Francis of Assisi**  
(1182 - 1226)  
The most similar to Jesus



In his incarnation in Italy, he experienced love for all Nature's creatures. He dedicated his life to the service of others and became the spirit who resembled Christ's life on Earth. He had previously reincarnated in the 1st century near Galilee. He was known as John the Evangelist, the disciple of Jesus and the author of the "Apocalypse".

In 1517 he reincarnated in Portugal and went to Brazil as the Jesuit priest Manoel da Nobrega. He worked in defense of the indigenous people of Brazil. In 1613, in Spain, he was known as Father Damiano, a priest and educator. In the 1st century B.C.E. he was the Roman Senator Publio Lentulus. He lived in Galilee, where he met Christ and wrote a letter to "Caesar" detailing his impressions of him.

This spirit had several reincarnations in the religious scenery. In 1751 she reincarnated in Salvador, Bahia as the Abbess Joana Angélica de Jesus, and participated in the independence of Brazil. In 1651, in Mexico, she was known as Sor Juana Inés de la Cruz (1651-1695), the greatest female intellectual and a baroque writer of the Spanish Golden Age. In the 1st century A.D. she was Joan of Arc, who lived in Israel and converted to Christianity after meeting Jesus. Christ's influence in the reincarnations of many spirits has helped them in their spiritual progress.

## Group Reincarnations

There are spirits that reincarnate in groups to accomplish collective tasks. Spirits of the great masters of Athens, from the "Pericles Century" or Athens' Golden Age (439-336 B.C.E.), reincarnated in the 15th century as the Italians Leonardo da Vinci, Raphael, Michelangelo, in order to implement the Renaissance. The Athenian philosophers returned in the 17th century, especially to France, to establish the principles of laws and politics. These spirits were known as Voltaire, Montesquieu and Rousseau.

**Joan of Arc**  
(1412 - 1413)  
Heroine betrayed by her country



The young French heroine reincarnated in the 14th century, and helped in the liberation of her people from British rule. She was betrayed and burned alive because she heard "voices" that inspired her. In a previous incarnation in the 1st century, she was Judas Iscariot, the disciple who betrayed Christ, and committed suicide after his crucifixion.

**John the Baptist**  
(2 B.C.E. - 27 C.E.)  
Preacher of Christ's coming



He reincarnated in Judea in the 1st century. He was Jesus' cousin and the one who broadcast the coming of the Messiah, the liberator of humankind. He was beheaded. In a previous existence in the 9th century B.C.E. he was the prophet Elijah, the greatest of the prophets, who had commanded the beheading of the priestess of Baal.

## When will it be a spirit's last reincarnation?



It will be when the spirit is free of material attractions, and learns to forgive, to be compassionate and humble, as was the case of Francis of Assisi.

**Pythagoras**  
(571 B.C.E. to 570 B.C.E.)  
Philosopher and Greek mathematician



The great Greek mathematician, founder of the Pythagorean school of "Thought", reincarnated in the 12th century B.C.E. as the Trojan warrior Euphorbus, who was killed by the Greek king Menelaus, Helen of Troy's husband, during the Trojan War. Pythagoras remembered a wound he had received in his chest from Menelaus' lance, and recognized the shield he carried on his left arm.
