

A Visual Guide to the SBA Dress Code

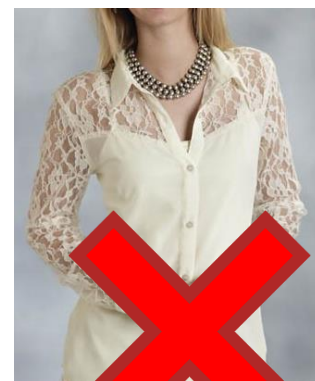
Students may wear polo, oxford, western-style or quarter-zip running shirts during the school day. Must have a collar and sleeves and no more than top two buttons may be unbuttoned.



Sweaters, turtlenecks or mock turtlenecks are allowed. A sweater is a knitted garment, typically one in which the yarn is thick enough that the knit pattern can be seen easily with the naked eye. This shall not include “athletic sweaters” or fleeces. Open sweaters/cardigans may be worn over solid color crew-neck t-shirts.



Crew-neck t-shirts may be worn under a shirt, but it must be a solid color with no printing. For ladies, solid colored undershirts/camisoles may be worn only as undergarments. For ladies, sheer or “burnt out” material is only acceptable when worn over a shirt adhering to the guidelines above; any visible portion of the shirt under the sheer or burnt out material must have *sleeves* not just straps.



All clothing must be in good condition, without holes, rips or fringed hems. Pants must be solid colored with no decoration anywhere other than the pockets. Skinny jeans, jeggings and yoga pants are not permitted.



Hemlines for dresses or skirts, both back and front, including slits, must be no higher than two inches above the top of the knee when standing or sitting.
