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**The Florida State University College of Music announces:  
Graduate Teaching Assistantships in Trumpet for Fall 2018**

Assistantships include: Full out-of-state tuition waiver for MM and DM degrees (9 hrs/semester/MM, 12 hrs/semester/DM) plus a stipend of \$5,900.00 - \$7,860.00 a year (fees are not covered). Assistantships may be renewed for a second year for outstanding Master's students. For Doctoral students, a third year is possible.

Duties Include: Teaching applied trumpet lessons to Music Majors, coaching undergraduate chamber music ensembles, performing in major ensembles as assigned, assisting with trumpet studio operations as needed, or other duties as assigned.

For Fall 2018, there will likely be 4-5 trumpet graduate assistantships available. The FSU trumpet studio typically has 30-35 students whose majors include: performance, music education, bachelor of arts, music therapy, and commercial music.

The Trumpet Studio at Florida State University has a strong tradition of excellence in its education and performance programs. Graduates and attendees of FSU have gone on to be employed in the field, either in Military Bands, Orchestras, and/or as University professors.
