German Beer Types

ALT (*cooper-colored ale, regional specialty*)
complex malts, aroma hops

BOCK
crisp or smooth malt taste (bock bier has a hint of sweetness),
amber to dark color

DUNKELS (*dark malty lager and black lager*)

HEFE WEIßBIER (*unfiltered wheat*)
zesty or smooth mouth feeling, light to dark color

HELLES (*pale colored lager*)

KÖLSCH (*fruity light ale, regional specialty*)
crisp or smooth hop taste, light color

PILSENER (*hoppy crisp lager*)
