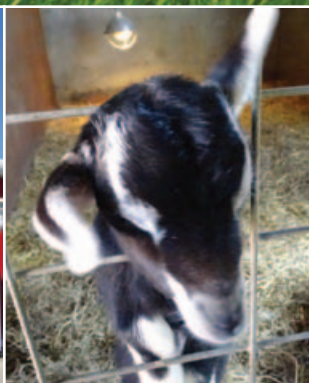

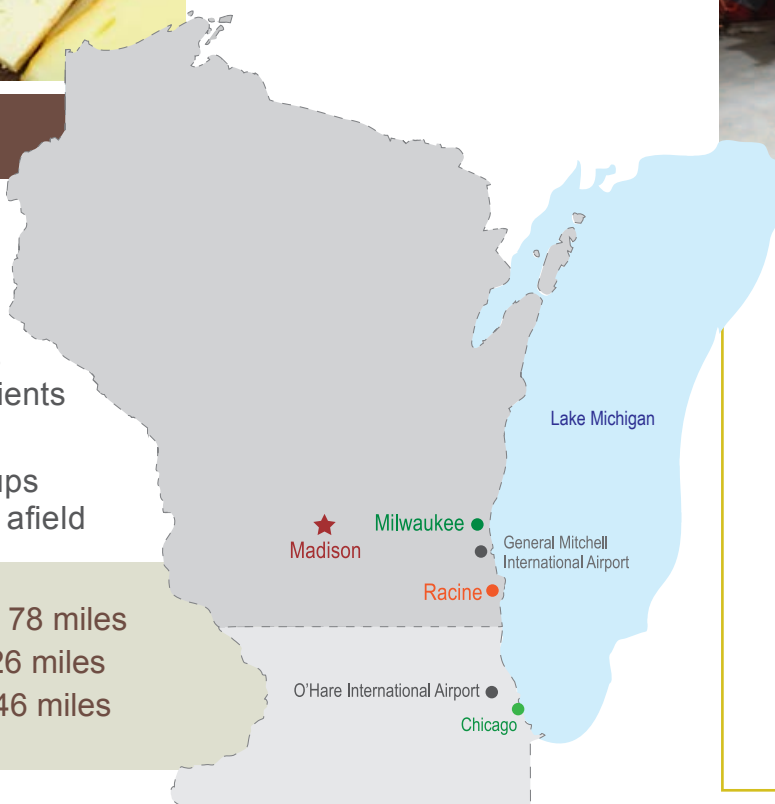

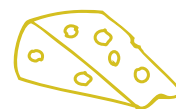


WISCONSIN'S TOP AG EXPORT MARKETS:
