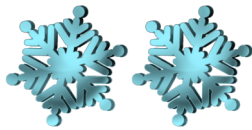

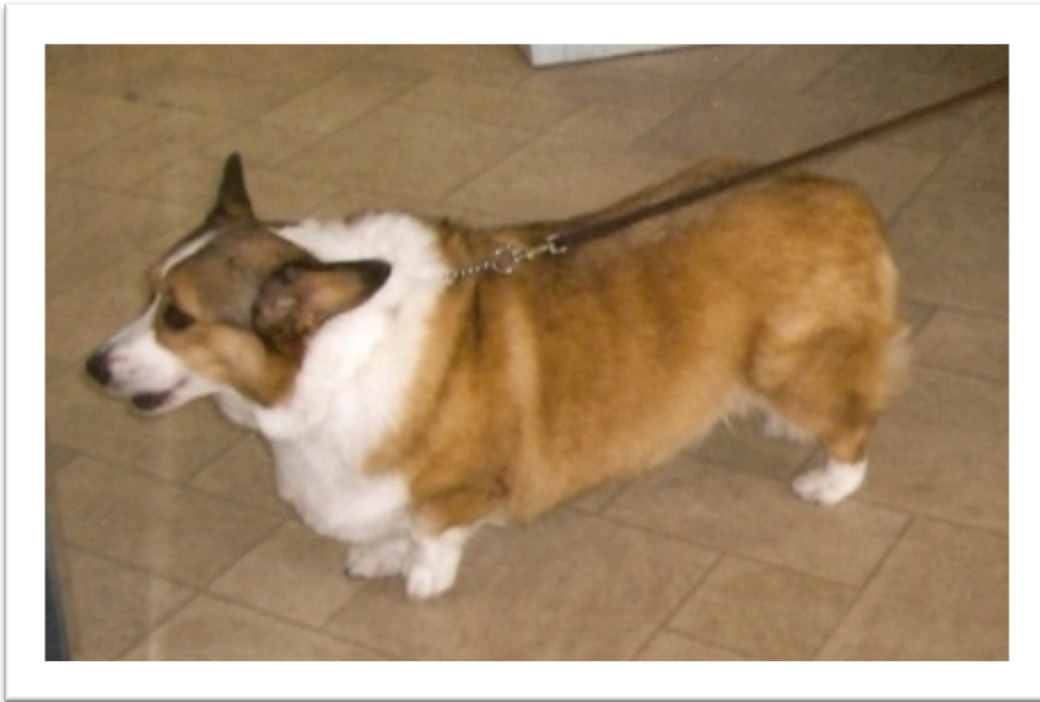
A Success Story

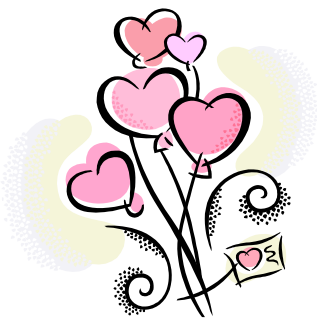

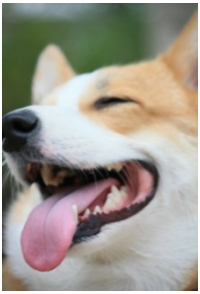
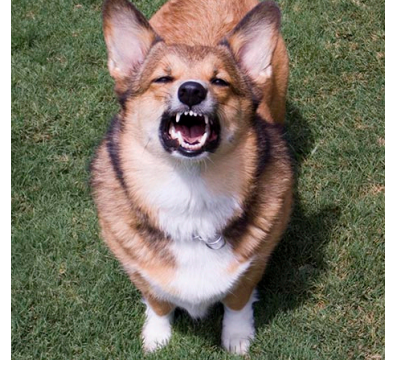

NEW!!!! Dental Clinic to be Added

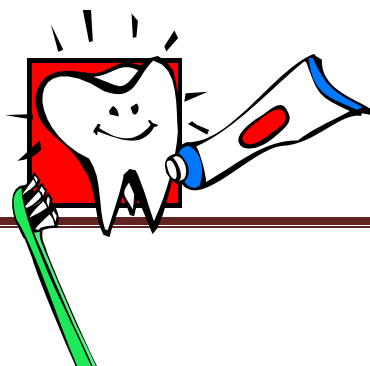
*This year, for the first time, we
