

Summary of A Project for Japan:

Visitors enjoyed their time in Nebraska and had an opportunity to learn about the rich agricultural opportunities and innovation in our state. They arrived over a weekend and were able to participate in excursions including a tour at Whole Foods, where they experienced some regional Thanksgiving dinnner menu items. This tour introduced an organic chain food store and not only how they selected their food products, but how much the consumer drives the decision making in product selection; i.e. the consumer's demand to know where their food was made and how it was made. They also learned how the family owned farmer versus the corporate food companies compete in this natural/organic chain food store.

Visitors toured the state capitol and learned some history of Nebraska as well as engaged in a meeting with Secretary of State John Gale and Governor Pete Ricketts. The Governor and his staff discussed their role in promoting Nebraska's products here and abroad and the importance of U.S. trade policy for the State of Nebraska. Susan Rouch, Export Development Manager from the Nebraska Department of Economic Development also participated in this discussion.



Visitors began their appointments on Friday with Lieutenant Governor, Mike Foley. He shared history and background of Nebraska's unique Unicameral Legislature and engaged in conversation regarding current U. S. and domestic policy. While at the State Capitol, visitors were given a tour and met with Secretary of State, John Gale, who presented each with a certificate of Honorary Citizenship. Senator Adam Morfeld also shared his perspective as a Nebraska Senator on U. S. and domestic policy.

Visitors met with Vince Powers, Former Chair of the Nebraska Democratic Party and Kenny Zoeller, Executive Director of the Nebraska Republican Party. Each party gave their perspective on U. S. and domestic policy.

During their weekend stay, visitors engaged in a volunteer activity with the Lincoln Habitat for Humanity. They learned of the large refugee resettlement population in Nebraska. The weekend ended with a Super Bowl party at the home of Gary and Karen Heusel. LCIV members and friends also attended.

Their stay concluded with appointments at Nebraska Appleseed, Lincoln High School and NGage-Gage Area Growth Enterprise. Visitors learned how Nebraska Appleseed has advocated and affected change for minority and marginalized community members in Nebraska. At Lincoln High, they toured and shared in discussion with high school principal, Mark Larson. This gave visitors an opportunity to visit with a diverse group of students in a civics classroom and an ELL classroom. The final appointment in Beatrice, allowed visitors to learn about diversity and inclusion efforts in rural Nebraska and offered additional opportunities to discuss U.S. and domestic policy from a Nebraska rural perspective.

Visitors started their stay in Lincoln by visiting West Lincoln Elementary school. Representatives from both Lincoln Public School District and the building principal discussed how the district meets and serves the needs of non-native speakers in the school district and specifically at West Elementary. Visitors toured the school, observed classrooms, met with parents participating in the Family Literacy Program and had lunch in the school cafeteria.

Next visitors met with Lutheran Family Services and the Nebraska Health and Human Services State Refugee Coordinator. They learned about Local refugee relocation resettlement services; housing, job placement, health care, education and English as a Second Language classes in Nebraska. Visitors then met at the Midwestern African Museum of Art, Culture & Resource Center where they heard local refugee relocation success stories in Nebraska. This included examples of maintaining and celebrating native culture, educational programming and gathering spaces in Nebraska. Their first day ended at Nebraska Appleseed learning about Nebraska is Home, an affiliate of Welcoming America.

Additional appointments included the Nebraska History Museum, the Yazidi Cultural Center, a tour of the State Capitol and "Welcome to Nebraska" by Secretary of State John Gale. Visitors ended their professional appointments at TMCO, where they toured the plant and spoke with a few of the employees who came to the United States as refugees. The visitors learned first hand how a culture of hiring refugees makes economic sense from a business perspective in addition to "doing the right thing".
