
Dino Days @ Ray County Library

We used larger 5 inch dinosaurs to make fossils in the dough. It makes neat looking fossils. I put the fossils in the oven at 170 degrees, for the remainder of the program so they would harden a bit before the end.

Dinosaur Dora tells Max she can write a letter to the T-rex. Max writes the T-Rex, and the T-Rex writes Max. Finally, Max gets to go back to the museum.

Use vinegar and the dropper to find the dinosaur.






Draw a T-rex








1. Make fold lines. Draw an oval as shown.







3. Draw the top and bottom of the head.




6. Add the feet and toes.




4. Add the mouth. Erase inside oval lines.
