LEVEL OF FITNESS



To get the most from your Bunnik tour, you will need a good level of fitness and mobility and an open mind. Many of the best sights can only be accessed on foot. You should be able to walk at least 3.5km or for 2-3 hours on uneven ground with no walking aids, and climb several flights of stairs. You should also be able to carry your own bags to and from your hotel room if required. Passengers who are 70 and over will be required to obtain a doctor's clearance before travelling.














CHOOSING THE RIGHT COMPANY








Our Coach

How to Book

To confirm your booking, we will need a non-refundable deposit of \$750 per person for small group tours (excludes Arctic Norway \$4,000 per person), and \$1,000 per person for Cruise & Tours. Other deposits may be required, depending on extra arrangements you book with us.

Travel Insurance

You will also need to arrange travel insurance. This is not a choice, it's compulsory as we'd hate for something to happen and you not be covered.

Payment Schedules

About 4-8 weeks after your booking has been confirmed, we'll request a progress payment in order to cover airfares, taxes and fuel

surcharges. The progress payment for Europe is \$2,750 per person. This amount increases if you are flying premium, business or first class. This payment allows us to issue your flight tickets and ensures you don't get hit with airline increases on fuel surcharges and taxes. Your final balance is due 60 days before you depart, depending on the tour you have booked (120 days for Cruise & Arctic Tours). You'll find our cancellation policy and other terms and conditions in the back of this brochure or you can ask one of our consultants.

Passports and Visas

Australian travellers require visas for a number of countries. We can help you obtain them. It's important to note that they can take time to arrange, so early booking is recommended.

We will also require a photocopy of your passport which must be valid for travel for at least six months from the date you are planning to return to Australia.

Your Travel Documents

Your documents, including itineraries and hotel lists, are prepared approximately three weeks before you depart. If you require your documentation earlier than this, please be sure to let us know.

Tipping Made Easy

Tipping is not a part of everyday Australian life, so many of us feel unsure about when or how much to tip. However, tipping is expected in many of the countries we visit and often makes up a large part of people's wages, so it's important to get it right. For this reason we have developed a program for selected destinations. This simple system sees us collect tips at the time of booking. We then pass these tips to our local staff and they take care of all the tipping. Easy! For logistical reasons it's compulsory that all tour members participate in 'Tipping Made Easy'. Please note: Tipping is not included for the cruise portion of any Cruise & Tour, unless stated.

Itinerary

Day 1. Depart Australia

Day 2. Arrive Moscow

Welcome to Moscow, Russia's cosmopolitan capital! Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director this evening for a welcome drink.

Day 3. Moscow

Today we discover the highlights of Moscow. Marvel at the city's lavishly decorated metro stations, walk through Red Square, admire St Basil's Cathedral and see Moscow University. Tonight we'll enjoy a group welcome dinner. [B,D]

Day 4. Moscow

Visit the famous Kremlin, a magnificent architectural ensemble of museums, cathedrals, palaces and towers, and the symbol of the USSR during the Cold War. The remainder of the day is free for you to explore the city at your own pace. [B]

Day 5. Moscow - St Petersburg

This morning we travel north via high-speed train to the beautiful city of St Petersburg, an elegant display of Imperial Russia and the birthplace of the Russian revolution. This afternoon we'll visit the world-famous Hermitage Museum. [B]

Day 6. St Petersburg

We visit the stunning Peterhof Grand Palace and its exquisite gardens this morning. Later this afternoon we'll enjoy a panoramic city tour, taking in the baroque Winter Palace, Peter ϑ Paul Fortress and the impressive Cathedral of Peter ϑ Paul. [B]

Day 7. St Petersburg

Enjoy a day at leisure. Why not visit the museums, take a cruise along the canals, go shopping or stroll through the beautiful Summer Garden? [B]

Day 8. St Petersburg - Tallinn

We cross the Russian border into neighbouring Estonia, the smallest of the three Baltic states. We'll travel through the countryside to arrive in the UNESCO World Heritage-listed city of Tallinn. [B]

Day 9. Tallinn

Today we explore medieval Tallinn. Step back in time as we tour the Old Town, stopping at the 15th century gothic Town Hall and St Nicholas Church. The afternoon is free for you to discover this picturesque city at your own pace. [B]

Day 10. Tallinn - Riga

We continue to the Latvian capital, Riga, stopping en route at the gothic Turaida Castle. [B]

Along the way we'll visit a secret underground Soviet bunker. Declassified in 2003, the Ligatne Bunker was constructed in the 1980s for the political and powerful elite who would govern the state in the event of a nuclear war.

Day 11. Riga

This morning we discover Old Riga on a walking tour. Highlights include St Peter's Church, the Dome Cathedral, the ancient Hanseatic city, the Freedom Monument and Old Riga Castle. [B]

We'll go behind the scenes of the Riga Opera. Our backstage pass includes a champagne reception.

Day 12. Riga - Vilnius

Receive a rococo-style welcome at Rundale Palace. We'll be greeted in accordance with court etiquette and escorted through the opulent apartments, before enjoying a short baroque music concert.

We then cross the border into Lithuania and make our way to Vilnius. Along the way, we'll visit the





Hill of Crosses, a sacred pilgrimage site where many thousands of crosses have been placed as a plea for blessings. During Soviet times, the crosses would be removed by the authorities but within hours they would start to reappear. [B]

Day 13. Vilnius - Minsk

This morning we tour the beautiful capital, Vilnius, known for its baroque architecture and alluring charm. Later we'll cross the border into Belarus and travel into the forest to visit a small farm that produces delicious local honey. We'll taste the produce and enjoy a cup of tea in the beautiful natural setting. [B]

For the next 2 nights we'll be staying in a beautifully restored 17th century building - a former monastery of the Bernadines.

Day 14. Minsk

Known as the city of light, Minsk is full of symbols of Soviet strength, making it a fascinating place to visit. Our city tour this morning includes the Soviet-style local market and the heart of the Old Town. [B]

Day 15. Minsk - Brest

We depart Minsk and travel southwest to the charming town of Brest. You will definitely notice the difference in architectural styles as we move further into central Europe. We'll take a city tour this afternoon. [B]

Day 16. Brest - Warsaw

Travelling west, we cross the border into Poland. Watch the rolling hills and verdant forests pass us by as we make our way to the capital, Warsaw. [B]

Day 17. Warsaw

Our morning tour of the city includes the reconstructed Old Town, a drive along a portion of the Royal Route, a visit to the Warsaw Ghetto Memorial and a stop at the Chopin Monument. [B]

Day 18. Warsaw - Krakow

Today we continue to Krakow, a harmonious and elegant city, rich in history. En route we'll pay a moving visit to the Auschwitz concentration camp, which stands as a poignant reminder of the horrors of World War II. [B]

Day 19. Krakow

This morning we'll visit the UNESCO World Heritage Wieliczka Salt Mine -

one of the world's oldest operating mines, dating back to the 13th century.

In the afternoon, we tour Krakow. At its heart is the historic Old Town Square - make sure you look up when we enter St Mary's Church, the interior is unexpectedly breathtaking. [B]

Day 20. Krakow - Cesky Krumlov

Today we cross the border into the Czech Republic and make our way to the fairytale village of Cesky Krumlov. [B]

Day 21. Cesky Krumlov - Prague

At our discretion we, including the service provider, can exclude you in a tour or in any activity if we consider that you are unable to safely participate in that tour or activity or if we consider your participation may place the safety of other guests at risk

We exclude all liability for any illness, injury or death sustained by you on tour because of any pre-existing medical condition. You release us from all liability arising out of your medical condition, illness, or injury that you may suffer during the tour or as a result of the tour.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

While travel insurance is not inclusive in the tour fee, it is mandatory for all our clients travelling on a Bunnik Tour to obtain comprehensive travel insurance to cover you throughout the whole duration of the tour to cover costs associated with illness, injury, death, loss of or damage to baggage and personal items, cancellations, loss of deposit, medical and hospitalization expenses, repatriation and curtailments expenses due to illness, the need to return home unexpectedly, evacuation expenses, and accidental death or disability. This should be taken out at time of booking.

It is your responsibility to obtain comprehensive travel insurance, however please note that travel insurance offered by credit card companies may not be considered adequate cover.

AMENDMENT FEES

A fee of \$50 or more per person, per change plus any further cost we incur will be charged for any revision or alteration made to a reservation after the booking is confirmed unless the change increases the price of the booking. Costs and charges may increase the closer to the departure date that changes are made, so you should contact

CONSUMER CLAIMS


