Size does matter!


Does size really matter? When it comes to group touring, absolutely!



In 2017, 95% of our passengers had two seats on the bus!


A Bunnik Tour


Moroccan Kasbah

Tipping Made Easy

Tipping is not a part of everyday Australian life, so many of us feel unsure about when or how much to tip. However, tipping is expected in many of the countries we visit and often makes up a large part of people's wages, so it's important to get it right.

For this reason we have developed a program for selected destinations. This simple system sees us collect tips at the time of booking. We then pass these tips to our local staff and they take care of all the tipping. Easy! It is compulsory for logistical reasons that all tour members participate.

Our tours include:


- 1. Generous amounts of free time

Bunnik Tours travellers need to:

- 1. Be able to walk 2-3 hours on uneven surfaces
- 2. Walk up multiple flights of stairs and short, steep hills
- 3. Stand for 20 minutes without needing to sit down, often in hot/humid climates
- 4. Carry their own luggage
- 5. Get on and off various modes of transport without assistance, including small boats



Day 1. Depart Australia

Day 2. Arrive Moscow

Welcome to Moscow, Russia's cosmopolitan capital! Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director this evening for a welcome drink.

Day 3. Moscow

Today we discover the highlights of Moscow. Marvel at the city's lavishly decorated metro stations, walk through Red Square, admire St Basil's Cathedral and see iconic Moscow University. Tonight we'll enjoy a group welcome dinner. [B,D]

Day 4. Moscow

Visit the famous Kremlin, a magnificent architectural ensemble of museums, cathedrals, palaces and towers, and the symbol of the USSR during the Cold War. The remainder of the day is free for you to explore the city at your own pace. [B]

Day 5. Moscow - St Petersburg

This morning we travel north via high-speed train to the beautiful city of St Petersburg, an elegant display of Imperial Russia and the birthplace of the Russian Revolution. This afternoon we'll visit the world-famous Hermitage Museum. The third-largest museum in the world, it houses more than 3 million masterpieces, including artwork by famous sculptors and artists such as Leonardo Da Vinci, Raphael, Rembrandt and Picasso! [B]

Day 6. St Petersburg

We visit the stunning Peterhof Grand Palace and have some free time to wander through the exquisite gardens this morning. Later this afternoon we'll enjoy a panoramic city tour, taking in the baroque Winter Palace, Peter & Paul Fortress and the impressive Cathedral of Peter & Paul. [B]

Day 7. St Petersburg

Enjoy a day at leisure. Why not visit the museums, take a cruise along the canals or go shopping on Nevsky Prospekt? [B]

Day 8. St Petersburg - Tallinn

We cross the Russian border into neighbouring Estonia, the smallest of the three Baltic states. We'll travel through the countryside to arrive in the UNESCO World Heritage-listed city of Tallinn. [B]

Day 9. Tallinn

Today we explore medieval Tallinn. Step back in time as we tour the Old Town, stopping at the 15th century gothic Town Hall and St Nicholas Church. The afternoon is free for you to discover this picturesque city at your own pace. [B]



Day 1. Depart Australia

Day 2. Arrive in Istanbul

Welcome to magical Istanbul, the city where East meets West, at the border of Asia and Europe. Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director tonight for a welcome drink.

Day 3. Istanbul

Today we'll explore the opulent Topkapi Palace, once home to the great sultans. We'll also visit the iconic Blue Mosque, the aromatic Spice Bazaar and the famous Grand Bazaar. Tonight we enjoy a group welcome dinner at a local restaurant. [B,D]

Taste some Turkish delicacies. Think baklava and Turkish coffee, and of course, Turkish delight!

Day 4. Istanbul

We visit the famous Hippodrome today (once the heart of Istanbul's political and sporting life), the Underground Basilica Cistern and the magnificent domed Basilica of Hagia Sophia. Day 6. Çanakkale - Troy - İzmir

This morning we visit Troy, one of the oldest discovered cities in Asia Minor where the legend of the wooden horse was born, before continuing to the ancient city of Pergamum, once ruled by Alexander the Great. [B,L,D]

For lunch we'll watch a traditional Turkish pide-making demonstration and taste this local delicacy.

Day 7. İzmir - Cappadocia

This morning we fly to UNESCO World Heritage-listed Cappadocia, renowned for its spectacular landscape. On arrival we explore the Zelve Valley, one of the most important settlements and religious centres for the Christian community between the 9th and 13th centuries, and the local villages of Ortahisar and Mustafapasa. [B,D]

Day 8. Cappadocia

Visit the hidden monastic valley of Paşabaği and a traditional carpet factory to learn how the beautiful Turkish carpets are made today. Next we explore the Göreme Valley, situated amongst the amazing 'fairy chimneys'. The landscape has been eroded by rain over thousands of years, giving rise to these strange rock formations.

Follow the paths of the stunning Red Valley as the sun sets this evening and admire the richly coloured rock formations. [B,D]

Day 9. Cappadocia - Konya

We explore the village of Avanos, famous for its ceramic art dating back to the 12th century BC. We'll then visit one of the many underground cities for which Cappadocia is famous - some of them are up to 80 metres deep, spread over eight levels. [B]

Day 10. Konya - Pamukkale

Today we'll visit the Mevlana Museum and learn about the mystical religious sect known as the Whirling Dervishes. We also

see talhöyük, the largest and best-preserved Neolithic site dating back to around 5,700 BC and characterised by its spectacular wall paintings. [B,D]

Day 11. Pamukkale - Kuşadasi

Today we explore the amazing landscape of Hierapolis, an ancient Greek city sitting on the site of Pamukkale. Over a period of 14,000 years, nature has created a unique grouping of hot springs that cascade over a cliff, forming pools. This afternoon we continue to Kuşadasi via beautiful Aphrodisias and its famed Sculpture School. [B]

Day 12. Ephesus Excursion

Step back in time as we visit Ephesus, the largest Roman city ever uncovered. We'll walk the streets, passing by the Library of Celsus, the Temple of Artemis and the Sacred House of the Virgin Mary, where she is reputed to have spent her last days. [B]

Day 13. Kuşadasi - Patmos

Embark Cruise: This morning we embark on a cruise of the Greek Islands. The first port of call is the timeless island of Patmos. Originally a hillside cave, its famed Monastery of St John sits atop the island's highest hill. [B,L,D]

Day 14. Rhodes

We cruise onwards to Rhodes, former home to one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World - the now-demolished Colossus of Rhodes. [B,L,D]

Day 15. Crete - Santorini

We reach Crete, Greece's largest island and home to the legendary Minotaur. We continue our journey to what many regard as the most beautiful island of the Aegean, Santorini. [B,L,D]

Day 16. Piraeus - Nafplio

Disembark Cruise: We disembark the cruise and head to Corinth to see the ancient sites before visiting the ancient theatre of Epidaurus. We then make our way to Nafplio.[B]

Day 17. Nafplio

Today we explore a citadel with Cyclopean walls in Mycenae. Next we head to the region of Nemea where we visit a local winery and take part in a wine tasting.

This morning we visit the home of the Olympic Games, Olympia. We'll discover ancient sites including the Temple of Zeus, the Palaestra and Phidias's Workshop, and tour the museum. We'll continue to the fortified coastal town of Nafpaktos this afternoon. [B]

Day 19. Nafpaktos

From the village of Diakopto, we'll embark on a 'Rack and Pinion' train journey along the 19th century Odontotos Rack Railway through the stunning Vouraikos Gorge. [B]

Day 20. Nafpaktos - Delphi - Kalambaka

This morning we visit Delphi, considered by the ancient Greeks to be the centre of the world. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the archaeological ruins including the Sanctuary of Apollo and the Treasury of Athenians and visit the museum, home to the famous "bronze charioteer". [B]



Day 1. Depart Australia

Day 2. Arrive Thessaloniki

Welcome to Greece and the port city of Thessaloniki in the country's north! Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director this evening for a welcome drink.

Day 3. Thessaloniki

Thessaloniki is the perfect base from which to explore Greece's Macedonia prefecture, and today we discover some of the picturesque local towns. We'll visit Edessa and its waterfalls, and Pella, the birthplace of Alexander the Great. This evening we'll discover the beautiful waterfront district of Ladadika on foot before a group welcome dinner. [B,D]



Day 2. Arrive Larnaca - Limassol

Welcome to Cyprus and the delightful city of Limassol! Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director this evening for a welcome drink.



Day 1. Depart Australia

Day 2. Arrive Bologna

Welcome to Italy and the beautiful capital of the Emilia-Romagna region, the medieval city of Bologna! Meet your fellow travellers and Tour Director for a welcome drink this evening.

Day 3. Bologna

This morning we explore lively Bologna. Highlights include the sprawling Piazza Maggiore, the Basilica di San Petronio, Neptune Fountain and Two Towers. [B,D]

We'll take a pasta-making class and enjoy our creations for our group welcome dinner this evening.

Day 4. Parma & Modena Excursion

Visit the 'Food Valley' of Modena and Parma for a day tasting cheese, lambrusco, balsamic vinegar and prosciutto.

Here we see parmigiano-reggiano being made at a cheese factory and enjoy a cheese tasting with lambrusco. Our next stop is the Acetaia, where we sample a family's traditional balsamic vinegar, made with an ancient recipe. We then see the prosciuttomakig process, before enjoying a sample along with another glass of lambrusco. [B]

Day 5. Bologna - San Marino - Urbino

This morning we depart for the Marche region, making a stop at the petite country of San Marino. We cross the border here and see the many amazing castles and villages perched atop clifftops. After enjoying some free time, we then continue to the idyllic Italian town of Urbino, where we enjoy a city tour of the highlights including the Ducal Palace, Church of San Domenico and the Dome. [B,D]

Day 6. Urbino - Ascoli Piceno

Today we will explore the Frasassi Caves, the longest in Italy. With a central chamber 240 metres high, it is large enough to comfortably fit the Milan cathedral! We then head to the Conero Riviera where we enjoy locally grown mussels for lunch at a local restaurant, complete with an incredible sea view. [B,L]

Day 7. Ascoli Piceno

We take to the footpaths of Ascoli Piceno today for a walking tour, discovering its historical riches and piazza. On our tour we also sample the typical Ascoli olives, which are fried and stuffed with delicious meat. [B]

We'll visit a winery in Offida surrounded by breathtaking scenery and enjoy a wine tasting along with regional produce.

Day 8. Ascoli Piceno - Locorotondo

Today we depart for Apulia, stopping on our way to admire the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Castel del Monte, a historic octangular castle dating back to the 13th century. Next, we continue to Andria, and taste the local dish burrata, a delicious cheese stuffed with cream and mozzarella strips. [B,D]

Day 9. Locorotondo

Altamura, one of Apulia's most ancient cities, is our first stop today. Interestingly, a human fossil was found here, as well as more than 30,000 dinosaur imprints. Here we'll take a walking tour of the town and try the famous local bread at a bakery. Our next stop is Matera and is among the longest continually

inhabited settlements in the world. [B,D]

Day 10. Locorotondo

Today we explore more of the Alberobello area and visit the towns of Ostuni, the famous white city, and Cisternino with its cute white chalk houses. Tonight, we enjoy dinner in a typical vucciria, complete with little butcheries. [B,D]

Day 11. Locorotondo - Lecce

Countless intricate baroque buildings await us on our sightseeing tour in Lecce today. In the afternoon we continue to Otranto, a magical town overlooking the Adriatic Sea. [B.D]

Day 12. Lecce

After breakfast, we head to Gallipoli, an old fishing village by the Ionian Sea where we explore the heart of the town and its bustling fish markets. Our lunch will be at a local restaurant, with produce picked from the local fish market. [B,L]

On our way to Athens we visit Delphi, considered by the ancient Greeks to be the centre of the world. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the archaeological ruins including the Sanctuary of Apollo, the Treasury of Athenians and visit the museum, home to the famous 'bronze charioteer'. [B]

Day 19. Athens

today at Salstraumen Maelstrom. Here up to 4 million cubic metres of seawater forces its way through a 3-kilometre-long and 150-metre-wide strait every six hours. We then fly back to Oslo where we enjoy a dinner to farewell magnificent Norway. [B,D]

Day 12. Oslo - Reykjavik

After a morning at leisure, we transfer to the airport for our flight to Iceland! We'll arrive in the city of Reykjavik, the world's most northerly capital. The rest of the day is at leisure to relax or begin exploring. [B]

Day 13. Reykjavik

Visit Reykjavík's landmarks on a sightseeing tour this morning. We'll admire the city from the viewing deck of the famous 'Perlan' building, visit Hallgrímskirkja Church and explore the old harbour area. This afternoon we visit the incredible Blue Lagoon for a dip in the therapeutic, mineral-rich waters. [B]

Day 14. Reykjavik - Siglufjord

This morning we discover the top of a volcano in Grabrok, enjoying scenic views over Borgarfjörður. We'll then continue past Skagafjörður, famous for breeding Icelandic horses, and travel to the picturesque fishing town of Siglufjord, formerly known as the herring capital of the world. [B]

Highlights of this area include Dimmuborgir, the Skutustadir pseudo craters, and the sulphurous and volcanic Namaskard and Krafla areas with hot springs to relax in. [B,D]

Day 16. Húsavík Excursion

We travel to Húsavík, the whalewatching capital of Europe, and board a cruise to spot these majestic creatures in their natural habitat.

As we return, we'll stop to see Godafoss, the 'waterfall of the Gods', and one of the most spectacular in Iceland! [B,D]
