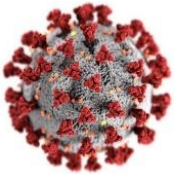

COVID-19 Outbreak



The North Summit Lions Club hopes all our members and their families will be kept healthy and safe during the COVID-19 virus. In an effort to protect the safety and well-being of our members and guests, we have canceled our Spring Texas Hold-'Em Poker Tournament and suspended all meetings until further notice. We will continue to communicate with you regularly and find a balance to keep us safe as we serve our communities.

Here is some safety information for dealing with the threat of COVID-19:

PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE:

- Wash your hands, especially after touching frequently used items or surfaces.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or the inside of your elbow.
- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces daily in household common areas.

Symptoms, which generally appear two to 14 days after exposure, include fever, cough, and difficulty breathing. Most people who become sick do not require hospitalization, but older adults, people with chronic health conditions, and people with compromised immune systems are more likely to require more advanced care. Seek prompt medical attention if you develop emergency warning signs, like difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion or inability to arouse, or bluish lips or face.

Reliable and valid information can be found by referring to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) (www.cdc.gov), Ohio Department of Health (coronavirus.ohio.gov), and Summit County Public Health (www.scph.org).

The local **Emergency Assistance Center** will continue to operate during normal business hours of Monday—Friday, 8 AM to 4 PM. Clients will come by appointment and stay in their cars. The TEAC is gladly accepting donations. See Items List at www.teacenter.org.
