After we lost Selah we began finding heart rocks all over the beach in Maine. Now we take them back to Nashville each year and put them on her grave.

We knew that at least four kids were in our future, but we couldn't have predicted having so many boys. After giving birth to five wonderful boys, we got pregnant with boy/girl twins in 2020. Everything was going well until they were delivered at 33 weeks. Our son, Audric, was born kicking and screaming and our baby girl, Selah, tragically passed away 7 hours later.

While her death is hard to make sense of, our faith is strong. We dont plan to have more biological children, but we still have a space in our hearts for a daughter. It is our hope that she can join our family through adoption.



OUR STORY


We met through mutual friends on an old social media platform called MySpace. It was a bit like Facebook, but before a time when it was "socially acceptable" to find new friends online.


We have now been together for 16 years and married for 13, and we have been choosing adventures together ever since!





















MEET BRITTANY

My Wife


I'm the luckiest guy in the world to be married to Brittany. She's **hardworking**, **caring**, **kind**, and the **best mom ever**.


Her love, and attention is the rock of our family and we're so thankful she's ours.


IN HER OWN WORDS




I also love knitting, and I have made hundreds of hats for friends and family, NICU babies, and fundraisers. Elliott and Ezra also enjoy knitting with me.

Not long after his comment, while still in high school, I got a job doing illustration and design for an early "dot-com" startup.


I continued working all through college when I helped start the company that I still work for today – where I've been fortunate to work on hundreds of great projects over years ranging from the Beatles to Star Wars.


Our Boys







We recite with our kids every day:


- Whatever you do, do it your best.

- And remember, Mommy and Papa love you very much, no matter what. And don't you forget it!






We feel strongly that **children learn best from experiences** and we try to give them lots of opportunities for new ones. Our oldest son,




















A glimpse into our home


and dad live on the same street and we





When we're ready to hit the road we all pile in our 15 passenger van, which has enough seats for everyone plus friends and family.







Mail on the island comes by boat and is delivered to this shed on the dock. Most of the people on the island make a living lobster fishing.


A DREAM COME TRUE














OUR TRADITIONS & CELEBRATIONS

DANIEL'S FAMILY


Daniel's parents live close by. His younger sister, older brother, and their families are also located in Nashville. We love to get together with them for all birthdays and holidays.


