Reminder to Residents with Dogs

According to Bylaw Number 631/18:

It is an offence for your dog to:

- ◆ Be At Large
- ◆ Be on Parkland while not on a leash and controlled by a capable Person
- ◆ Be on school property unless otherwise permitted or allowed by the School Board
- ◆ Be within a site containing playground apparatus and/or sand play area located on Public or Private Property other than the property of its Owner

DOES YOUR DOG HAVE A 2020 DOG LICENSE TAG?

According to Bylaw Number 631/18:

1. A resident of Bawlf who is the Owner of any Dog aged six (6) weeks or older shall obtain a license for the Dog from the office of the Village of Bawlf as per Bylaw 629/18 – Master Rates Bylaw.
2. The Owner of every Dog shall, annually, on or before January 31st, renew the license for that Dog by submitting to the Village the annual licensing fee, as set out in Bylaw 629/18 – Master Rates Bylaw along with any other information as may be required by the Village.

Schedule "A" Penalties: Part 3, Section 1: Failure to obtain dog license - first offence \$75.00, second offence \$150.00, third offence \$300.00
