"Grow in Christ...Share Our Faith"

Dear Beloved Family,

As many of you know, I am in seminary, which gives me lots of time to think...which can be dangerous. Recently, I have had opportunity to consider how we are created in God's image. Genesis tells us that men and women are all created in the image of God. This cannot possibly mean that we "look like God," for God is a spirit, and is invisible, according to Scripture. What then DOES it mean? Theologians for millennia have attempted to discern this unique distinction granted to people. Many concluded that we are different from animals because we employ reason, whereas animals only act upon instinct. Further, that animals do not have a capacity for emotion, especially love. I have always rejected these notions. Our little toy poodle, Casper, may serve to illustrate. If I am eating popcorn in our kitchen, Casper will bug me to share some with him. Not only is this not real healthy for him, but it also annoys me. So, I will throw a piece into the dining room for him to chase, and then close the door so he cannot return to the kitchen. After performing this twice, the third time he looked at the popcorn in the dining room, licked his chops, but stayed in the kitchen and kept bugging me. If that isn't reason over instinct, I don't know what would be!

Further, to suggest that animals do not have the capacity to love is ludicrous. My cat, Nina, is overjoyed when I return home at night -even when her bowl is full of food. And, she "scolds" me when I have been away for what she considers to be too long. What, then grants us the unique distinction of being in God's image, which brings with it the similarly unique opportunity to have dominion over the earth, and the requisite responsibility to positively care for and tend it toward health; and not simply exploit it to our own selfish advantage? John Wesley's conclusion was, a capacity for God. The capacity to have a spiritual life in relationship with God was what he considered to be the only distinguishing characteristic between people and animals. Further, in his sermon, "The General Deliverance," Wesley communicates his belief that animals will one day be restored to the capacity of humans, and humans will be restored to a greater capacity than angels. With this in mind, one of his requirements for Methodist Preachers was that they must each day properly rub down their horses and never ride them too hard. May we too realize the blessings and responsibilities incumbent upon us as those who share God's very image.
