Dear Beloved Family,

For the December newsletter, I would like to take a moment to express the joy and gratitude that Karen and I feel for you, our spiritual family, at this time of the year. Throughout Christmastide and Epiphany we will celebrate the grace of our Lord Jesus toward us in giving us spiritual riches beyond our comprehension. Some of these spiritual riches come to us through our connection to the Church. It is at this season of contemplation and celebration that the Judd family is reminded of the blessings God confers to us through each one of you.

This is not said to add more stress to your life, but only in order to say thank you for the gift of your regular presence in our lives, not only at Christmas but 52 weeks a year. You may not know it, but you give to us a great gift of joy just by being there for us all the time. We pray we will share the same gift of presence with you so that our joy may be complete. Merry Christmas!

Wildfires in California

The current string of California wildfires have produced unprecedented devastation. UMCOR remains in close conversation with the disaster response coordinators of the California-Pacific and California-Nevada Conferences of The United Methodist Church and is supporting both conferences as they identify and respond to the needs of those affected by the wildfires.

UMCOR has approved a request from the California-Nevada Conference for a solidarity grant of \$10,000 which will be used to help facilitate the replacement of personal clothing items and food through various resources. The conference Early Response Team (ERT) Coordinator has requested UMCOR buckets as well as hygiene and school kits. As the assessment of needs continues, UMCOR stands ready to provide additional support.

The recovery period for a disaster of such magnitude will be long, but thanks to your generous support, UMCOR and its partners will be able to provide hope and tangible assistance to those in need for years to come.

3. Give to UMCOR's relief and recovery efforts at umcor.org/donate (U.S. Disaster Response, Advance #901670; International Disaster Response, Advance #982450; Undesignated, Advance #999895).

4. Donate requested items only. To keep relief supplies in stock, give to Material Resources, Advance #901440 at umcor.org/donate.

5. Please wait for an invitation to volunteer.
