Dear Beloved Family,

While January 1 is in some ways another of many indistinct dates upon a calendar, it is simultaneously the beginning of a year (thank you, Gregory the Great) our culture will designate as 2019. A new year is a handy milestone from which to survey the past and consider the future. Our Church has made some important strives in the past year and a half, and we are poised to continue growth internally and externally through our ministries for Jesus Christ, thanks be to God!

On a local level, I am going to concentrate more on spiritual discipline #5, Fellowship, than I have until now. In 2017 we gave great emphasis to discipline #1, Rightly Dividing the Word of Truth. In 2018, we focused upon the spiritual renewal for our community which comes through disciplines 2 and 3: Meditation and Prayer (sometimes with fasting). In 2019, while not neglecting 1-3 or 4 (silent contemplation) I think we must begin to consider how Fellowship is a necessary component in our capability to hear the voice of God, as individuals and a corporate body. Sometimes Fellowship is packaged as social interaction, but that interaction is really just one component. If we are to interpret the Word of God as a community, we must know and respect one another in some close ways in order to know one another's baggage which is carried into the interpretive process. Everyone can see my emotional and cognitive presuppositions ("baggage") except me. Thus, we must rely upon one another, in sincere humility, to identify the blind spots we don't see about ourselves. This can only happen in genuine fellowship with one another. In this way our worship can transform from a monologue from the pastor to a dialogue between shepherd and flock, as demonstrated in the New Testament.

I trust fellowship will incorporate occasions for the Church family to have fun, interpret Scripture together in small groups and begin an international visitation plan. Please pray about our spiritual fellowship and contact me directly if you feel called to be involved in a Fellowship Team.

2019 is going to be great! Jesus be Praised!

Notes From Your Renewal Team

We have been very busy these past few months working on ways to build awareness of our church in the community.

First, we are looking to hold a Red Cross Blood Drive sometime in early spring. The Oxford Police Department and The Oxford Fire Department have an annual Blood Drive challenge and hopefully we will host the event. We are waiting on approval from the Red Cross as to whether the church has enough space and other requirements needed to hold a blood drive.

Second, we would like to have a "Blessing Of The Animals" also in the spring. This is to be held on the town common and perhaps in May a "Blessing Of The Motorcycles". More details will follow.

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, we are in the process reaching out to over 100 members of our church who, for whatever reason, have stopped coming to services. We are planning to hold some type of "welcome back/meet the new Pastor" service in March, again more details will follow.

We must all be reminded that the renewal of our church is not just in the hands of a 7member committee. It is up to every member of our congregation to do whatever she or he can to build awareness of our church and bring more people back to Christ. A way you can start is if you notice that your "Pew Buddy" has been absent for a while, reach out to that person. Let them know that you and their church family miss them and care about them.

As always, we welcome any and all suggestions that you may have regarding renewal.
