Dear Beloved Family,





From the Trustees

A big Thank You to all that donated to the window fund, we raised \$6,115.00 dollars, the project will be done soon. The price of the windows was \$2,800.00 they are vinyl windows, and the projected price of the vinyl siding \$4,600.00. That will do the back part of the building, excluding the brick. The siding is a Charcoal Gray, the existing windows and doors will be wrapped in aluminum flashing to extend their life.

Looking into the future, the projects on the table include fixing the sidewalks, filling the cracks and holes making it easy to walk on and not to trip, applying for a grant to replace the emergency exit doors at the front of the sanctuary.

Winter will be here soon, again this year we are using an ecofriendly salt mix with molasses. There will be buckets at the doors with shovels.
