
Annual Neighborhood Garage Sales

Historic Tree in our Neighborhood

Have you noticed the empty lot for sale on the corner of Berkshire and Alden? At the back of the lot is a Moses Cleaveland Tree. The Moses Cleaveland Trees were chosen from throughout Cuyahoga County in 1946 as part of the sesquicentennial of Moses Cleaveland and his party's landing at the mouth of the Cuyahoga River on 22 July, 1796.

Each tree was of such an age as to have been part of the area's forests at the time of the landing. The Cleveland Sesquicentennial Commission appointed the Committee on Moses Cleaveland Trees, whose objective was the discovery and labeling of 150 native trees over the age of 150 years growing in the county.

The Oak tree has a large trunk and big branches. Check it out – you can't miss it!
