From the Pastor


ear Community of St. Augustine,

A Glimpse from a Past

t. Augustine Parish was founded in August 1969 to serve the community of Casselberry, Florida. It was the first newly-created parish in the new Diocese of Orlando. Fr. James Martinez, O.S.A., was designated to be a pioneer in the southern mission and first pastor of our parish. Approximately 60 families gathered for the first Mass at the Casselberry Women's Club.

The parish membership continued to grow and the liturgy site was changed to the Cinema in Seminole Plaza. On July 25th, 1971 Bishop Borders dedicated a multi-purpose facility. This 6,000 square foot building served as the Church and parish activity center until 1979. An addition to the facility was completed in 1974 which still serves as parish office.

On St. Augustine's Day, 1978, ground was broken for the first existing church. The first Mass was held on Christmas Eve, 1979 with Fr. John Deary.

On Sunday, May 4th, 1980, the new church was dedicated by Bishop Thomas J. Grady. The church has been the dream of many since the beginning of St. Augustine Parish. The southeaster regional Interfaith Forum on Religious Art and Architecture (IFRAA) at the conference held in Orlando ,February 24-26, 1980, honored St. Augustine Church. A merit award was presented for the beauty of the interior design.


It was in these years of Fr. John Deary's pastorate that the community grew to approximately 1200 families.

The parish began worship services in Spanish in 1979. We were the first parish to do this in our county.

Our parish was under the direction of the Augustinian order from 1969 until 2005.

Since 2005 we have been staffed by diocesan priests starting with Fr. Luis Barrera, Fr. Ybaín Ramirez and currently with Fr. Tomás Hurtado.

The history of St. Augustine's is short in its chronology but ancient in its quest to follow the call of Saint Augustine to be of one mind and one heart intent upon God.

Un Vistazo al Pasado

1969: La parroquia de San Agustín fue fundada. Fue la primera parroquia recién creada en la nueva Diócesis de Orlando. El padre James Martinez, O.S.A, fue el primer párroco. Aproximadamente 60 familias se reunieron para la primera Misa en el Club de Mujeres de Casselberry. Debido al aumento de feligreses las Misas se cambiaron para el Cinema en Seminole Plaza.

1971: El Obispo Borders dedicó el edificio de multipropósito utilizado como iglesia y como centro de actividades.

1978: En la víspera de Navidad se celebra la primer Misa de la actual iglesia.

1979: Comienzan a celebrarse las Misas en español.

Nuestra parroquia estuvo bajo la dirección de la Orden de los Agustinos desde el 1969 hasta el 2005.

Desde el 2005 contamos con los sacerdotes diocesanos, comenzando con el padre Luis Barrera, luego el padre Ybaín Ramírez y actualmente con el padre Tomás Hurtado.







Beginnings of the **Hispanic Community**

n 1979, Monsignor Luis María Padilla, a Venezuelan priest, arrived at our parish. Father Padilla, seeing the growth of the Hispanic community, requested permission from the pastor, Father John Deary, to begin celebrating Masses in Spanish.

The first Mass in Spanish in our parish was celebrated on Sunday, September 30th, 1979 at 1:30pm. 52 people attended.

In 1981 the Hispanic Committee was formed with the objective of having a better coordination in the development of the community.

When the Augustinian priests made the decision to move from the diocese, Bishop Thomas Wenski appointed the Colombian priest, Father Luis Barrera as parish administrator in 2006. On December 1st, 2007, the 6:30pm Saturday Mass was added.

In 2010, Father Ybain Ramirez, of Venezuelan nationality, was appointed parish administrator. In September 2016, Father Tomás R. Hurtado was assigned to our community as a parish administrator by Bishop John Noonan.

Inicios de la Comunidad Hispana

n el año 1979 llega a nuestra parroquia Monseñor Luis María Padilla, sacerdote venezolano. El padre ■ Padilla al ver el crecimiento de la comunidad hispana solicitó permiso al párroco, el Padre John Deary para que se comenzara a celebrar las Misas en español.

La primera Misa en español en nuestra parroquia se celebró el domingo, 30 de septiembre de 1979 a la 1:30pm. Asistieron 52 personas.

En el año 1981 se formó el Comité Hispano con el objetivo de tener una mejor coordinación en el desenvolvimiento de la comunidad.

Cuando los sacerdotes agustinos tomaron la decisión de retirarse de la diócesis, el Obispo Thomas Wenski nombró como administrador parroquial al sacerdote colombiano, el padre Luis Barrera en el año 2006. El 1 de diciembre de 2007 se añadió la Misa de los sábados a las 6:30pm.

En el 2010 el padre Ybaín Ramírez de nacionalidad venezolana es nombrado administrador parroquial. En septiembre del 2016 el padre Tomás R. Hurtado fue asignado a nuestra comunidad como administrador parroquial por el obispo John Noonan.

May God's blessings be upon us each and everyday as we try to serve one and all.
















Memories . . .
