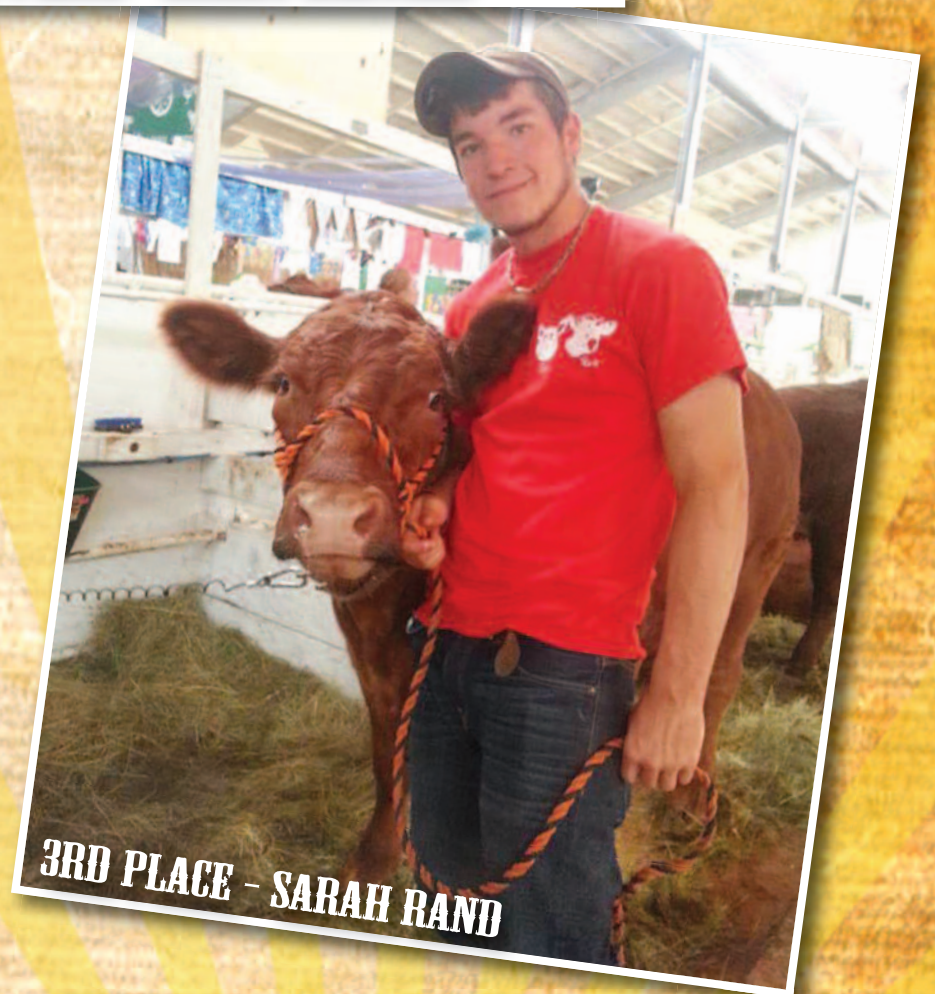


On behalf of Michigan's fair industry, welcome to the 2017 county fair season!

# The Gogebic County Fair celebrates 96th year

2017 marks the 96th year in which the Gogebic County Board of Commissioners have participated in the annual event. Fairs have been held at the fairgrounds current location since before the turn of the century, but prior to 1921 the event was organized by a group of Gogebic Range businessmen. One of the main purposes of the fairs

back in the 20's was promotional to draw people into the area, along with a place where local people would meet and get together.

The roots of the fair trace back to 1897, when a harness racing event took place at the former "Driving Park" the present site of the fairgrounds. Almost 5,000 people attended the event

In June 1906, the Curry family gave the park which adjoins the fairgrounds to the City of Ironwood. Today this area is known as Curry Park Campground. The annual harness racing event became a county fair in

1921, when the county board stepped into the picture to manage the fair along with a group called the Gogebic County Fair and Agricultural Association. Premiums offered that year were worth about \$4,000.00 compared to \$19,000 in premiums paid in 1999, and upwards of \$30,000 in premiums being paid out in 2008.

The fair was held to acquaint people with the agricultural activities, and stage shows were a part of the fairs since its beginning, reaching their peak success in the 1940's when Gene Autrey drew one of the largest crowds ever. In later years large crowds have been drawn by the likes of Sonny James, Sylvia, Jerry Reed, Monster Truck Shows, Trick Pony, Confederate Railroad and the Bellamy Brothers.

In the early years of the fair, the carnival midway was located near the Exposition Building and the current midway was a wooded area. In the 1920's the fair would run in September and local

business would close their doors, kids would be let out of school so everyone would be able to enjoy the fair. A large fireworks display would be a highlight on the first evening of the fair to raise attention that the fair was running.

In 1983, the fair seen a large increase in attendance with a record 25,000 people in attendance. that year Country singer Charlie McLain performed on the grandstand stage and there was a Michigan State Lottery Drawing. The grand prize was \$10,000 and was won by a grocery store manager from Escanaba.

After 96 years, fairgoers still enjoy the carnival rides, grandstand shows and of course the agricultural aspect of the fair. It's hard to believe that after 96 years you can still come down and enjoy many of the same events along with the one that started it all, the Harness Racing.

The Saturday and Sunday Horse Shows at the Gogebic County Fair will once again be open to the public. Please provide the horse name as well as the rider (s) names when sending in your stall reservation. Specific barn/stall requests will be considered but are not guaranteed. Stalls for individuals showing in the Open Show and not exhibiting for the four days of the Fair

### DEPARTMENT 48 AGRONOMY & HORTICULTURE ADULT CLASSES RULES AND REGULATIONS

In exhibiting farm crops, seed and breeding stock of superior quality is wanted, and premiums are given with this idea in view. Prizes are not offered for freaks and monstrosities, but are offered for exhibits that are to mean better and more profitable crop production later. Exhibit samples should be superior stock. In preparing your exhibit avoid anything that would detract from quality. The main feature of field crops exhibits should be superior quality of staple products. Run threshed samples of grain over the fanning mill; avoid mixtures and discoloration.

Numerical system in judging first, second and third unless otherwise stated, will be used. Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be permitted.

## Gogebic County 4-H Market Animal Auction F.A.Q's

All area businesses and individuals are encouraged to come and bid on the animals at the sale.

Following are a few of the commonly asked questions:

### Why should I attend the auction?

It's an opportunity to enjoy the highest quality meat products available anywhere.

### How do I bid?

Arrive well before the auction time to view the sale animals and talk to the 4-H members about their projects. When an animal you like comes into the ring, and bidding is at your price range, signal the auctioneer by raising your hand.

### Do I have to be present at the auction?

The auction is FUN! However, you can get someone to act on your behalf if you are unable to attend. Just contact any of the 4-H members or leaders involved in the sale.

### Can I share my purchase?

Any animal may be bought in the name of multiple businesses or individuals. That information is taken down at the clerk's table after the sale.

### What do I do after purchasing an animal?

The auction clerk will help you fill out the necessary paperwork. Payment can be made on the day of the sale or not later than August 31st. Trucking to one of the designated facilities is paid for by the club. Buyers are responsible for the cost of slaughtering, cutting and packaging of their meat. The packing company of your choice will work with you on this. Note: You may also take your animal home live if you want.

### Are purchases tax deductible?

If you keep your meat, you may deduct the difference between your purchase price and the market price for tax purposes.

### As A Buyer: You are greatly appreciated!!!

Your name will be listed with the rest of the buyers at the fair. You will also receive a color photo of the animal purchased and receive local media coverage.

When you buy at the 4-H Livestock Auction, you are making an investment in the future of the local 4-H member. The educational benefit of raising a market animal is invaluable to all of us!

# 2017 GOGEBIC COUNTY FAIR PREMIUM LIST - ADULT

## LIVESTOCK ADULT CLASSES RULES AND REGULATIONS

### NUMERICAL SYSTEM OF JUDGING

1. Entry day for livestock is Thursday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
2. Dairy, beef cattle, and horses in open and youth classes will be open to exhibitors from any area residence.
3. All livestock must be owned by the exhibitor.
4. Livestock must remain in place until 7 p.m. the last day of the fair.
5. Livestock exhibitors must provide their own bedding and feed.
6. Judging will start at 8 a.m., Friday. Youth classes first.
7. Judges will have full power to award places and reject unworthy entries.
8. All exhibitors are responsible for getting their entries to the show ring at the proper time.
9. All premiums will be paid by the numerical system for open classes.
10. Dairy cattle will show as purebred (must be registered or able to be registered) or grade. Beef cattle will show as purebred (must be registered or able to be registered) or commercial.
11. Each breed will be judged according to the recognized characteristics of that breed. Placing of each class will be based on breed character, quality, balance, and style.
12. Animals will be judged in the show ring unless the judge rules otherwise.
13. All cattle must be dehorned except for those belonging to a breed that recognizes horns as a characteristic of that breed.

**RULES FOR EXHIBITING POULTRY:**

- All exhibits will be fed and watered by management.
- All birds must be entered in the name of the bonafide owner on Thursday, opening day of the fair, between the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Terms defined: Cock – male bird hatched prior to current year.  
Cockerel – male bird hatched during current year.  
Hen – female bird hatched prior to current year.  
Pullet – female bird hatched during current year.  
Young Trio – 1 cockerel, 2 pullets.  
Old Trio – 1 cock, 2 hens.  
Meat Pen Trio (commercial broilers) – 3 any sex.  
Laying Pen Trio (commercial layers) – 3 pullets or 3 hens.  
Breed Trios to be judged 50% on the male and 25% on each female.  
Meat Pen and Laying Trios to be judged on uniformity and meat or egg laying potential.
- Birds entered in single classes cannot compete for Trio prizes; no birds entered in pens can compete for single prizes.
- Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits in this department, and for this purpose, watchmen will be on duty each night during the Fair. However, the Gogebic County Fair will not be liable for the loss of any specimen by death or otherwise.
- The Fair management reserves the right to reject any birds showing symptoms of disease or for any other well defined reasons.
- Premiums will be paid on the numerical system and only on the varieties listed in the premium list.
- Exhibits will be judged on Friday, beginning at 9 a.m. Premiums awarded based on general condition and typiness as defined by the American Poultry Association in the most recent edition of the APA Standard of Perfection.
- No exhibit will be allowed to leave the department early. Exhibits will be released at 7 p.m. on Sunday.
- Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be permitted.
- All exhibitors will be required to produce proof that their birds are from a pullorum free flock (USDA Form 9-2) or were purchased from a pullorum free flock within the past year (USDA Form 9-3). If exhibitors are not able to present either of these forms, their birds will be tested on site by a State of Michigan certified pullorum tester at no cost to the exhibitor. Pigeons, doves, and waterfowl are exempt from testing.

# OPEN HORSE SHOW RULES

## For Individuals attending Saturday and/or Sunday

1. A veterinarian can check each horse upon entering the fairgrounds.
2. Stalls MAY be available for individuals who would like to stay overnight on Friday or Saturday. A \$20 stall fee will be charged for each stall reserved, payable to the Horse Advisory Council. Availability of stalls will not be determined until after August 15th. Stall requests can be made by contacting Lori Bennetts @ (906) 364-1308. Individual reservations must be made, group reservations (ex: 4H club) will not be accepted. Requests for stabling together may be made but are not guaranteed. The stall coordinator will make the final decision on stall assignments. Stalls will be assigned by the Horse Advisory Council. There will be no refunds given. Stalls may only be reserved for horses – tack stall reservation is not allowed. No horses will be allowed in a stall until stall fees have been paid in full. Horse clerks have the authority to collect stall fees for those that have not been prepaid.
3. All horses must be in their stalls by 9:00 p.m. daily. Grooming of horses will be done ONLY in the wash area or in stalls. Horses will be walked – NOT RIDDEN – to and from the show arena. ALL RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY !
4. Animals must be humanely cared for and fed by 9 a.m. or an exhibitor will face POSSIBLE EVICTION AND PENALTY. THIS INCLUDES PROPER CLEANING OF STALLS ON A REGULAR BASIS.
5. An exhibitor may enter only one (1) horse per class. A horse may only be shown once per class per age division. Jr. and Sr. Horse Pleasure are considered to be a separate class from Western or English Pleasure.
6. Training and mechanical devices are prohibited in equitation and pleasure classes.
7. Only humane bits, spurs, curbs, etc. shall be permitted.
8. Horses six (6) years old and older must be bitted.
9. Exhibitor must show within their appropriate age division. Exhibitor age is as of January 1st of current year. An exhibitor is considered a youth if he/she is 19 yrs. of age or younger on January 1st. See Rule #21 for exception to this rule.
10. Exhibitors entering classes must have proper attire for respective classes to include appropriate hat, long sleeve shirt, long pants and boots. English classes must also include a jacket. Chaps are optional in all western classes. Attire required during participation in the action games on Sunday is long pants, boots, and a helmet for youth. AS REQUIRED IN SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS, "PARTICIPANTS IN ALL YOUTH HUNTER (BOTH OVER FENCES AND ON THE FLAT) AND ACTION GAME CLASSES ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR PROTECTIVE RIDING HELMETS. THE FAIR BOARD HIGHLY RECOMMENDS YOUTH HORSE SHOW PARTICIPANTS WEAR HELMETS AT ALL TIMES WHEN ON A HORSE.
11. Complaints must be filed with the Horse Superintendent within 24 hours of occurrence.
12. A County Horse Advisory Council has been appointed to hear grievances and make rulings on situations not covered by the premium list. Said Council will meet as necessary at the 4-H Horse Barn Office to hear any grievances. The Fair Board, however, reserves the right to make final decisions.
13. Failure to abide by rules and regulations may subject the exhibitor to eviction from the fairgrounds
14. The Open Horse Show performance classes will be held on Saturday, August 26, 2017 beginning at 9:00 a.m. with the Action Games to be held on Sunday, August 27, 2017 beginning at 9:00 a.m. for the Costume class followed by Speed Classes. This will be judged by the numerical system. Rosettes will be awarded. Participation in the Open Horse Show is not restricted. The Open Horse Show is governed by Gogebic County Horse Council Rules.
15. Class fees for the Open Horse Show will be \$3.00 per class or \$20.00 per day. (4-day exhibitors do not pay class fees)
16. Trailers must be parked outside of the West gate of the Fairgrounds.
17. Pony and mini size is 56" or less. Registered ponies and mini's must fit the size requirements for their breed.
18. Proof of current negative Coggins test will be required on all horses with the exception of a nursing foal. Out of state horses must have an inter-state health certificate.
19. Tiny Tot Class exhibitors must be under age 10 (as of January 1st of current year) and exhibit only in Tiny Tot Classes.
20. Walk-Trot Pleasure class is for the beginning horse who has never been shown in a canter class before. Walk-Trot Equitation (Horsemanship) is for the beginning rider who has never shown in a canter class. A Walk-Trot participant is limited to winning 1st place in the "Open Show" for a limit of 2 yrs. You may participate in this class after you have won twice, but you will not be placed in the class. Special needs riders are exempt from the 2 yr. limit.
21. Walk-Trot exhibitors who enter a Walk-Trot Horsemanship (Equitation) class may not enter any other canter performance classes. Any Walk-Trot exhibitor/horse combination who enters a Walk-Trot Pleasure class may not enter any other canter performance class (not including speed).
22. Special needs exhibitors are strongly recommended to wear a helmet at all times when handling a horse.

Please check at the horse registration area as to the order of the classes. Class order is always subject to change. If the change will affect any exhibitor, they will be notified of the change. Every effort will be made to accommodate all exhibitors; however, the show will need to keep moving ahead. Exhibitors should be advised that if a conflict arises, classes may be missed.

## OPEN HORSE SHOW RULES For 4 Day Exhibitors (Thurs – Sun)

- All exhibitors must register and have an identification number on or before the Monday preceding the fair.
- A veterinarian can check each horse upon entering the fairgrounds and before it can go in any stall.
- All horses must be entered and in the barns by 6 p.m. on Thursday. Horses will not be released from the Fairgrounds until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- Horse Exhibitors must pre-register with the Gogebic County Horse Advisory Council through the Gogebic County MSU Extension Office. A \$15 stall fee will be charged to all horse exhibitors, payable to the Horse Advisory Council. Payments can be made between the dates of June 1st through August 15th and can be mailed to Lori Bennetts, N10090 Barber Road, Bessemer, MI 49911. Individual reservations must be made, group reservations (ex: 4H club ) will not be accepted. Requests for stabling together may be made but are not guaranteed. The stall coordinator will make the final decision on stall assignments. Stalls will be assigned by the Horse Advisory Council. Attire required during participation in the action games on Sunday is long pants, boots, and a helmet for youth. **AS REQUIRED IN SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS, "PARTICIPANTS IN ALL YOUTH HUNTER (BOTH OVER FENCES AND ON THE FLAT) AND ACTION GAME CLASSES ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR PROTECTIVE RIDING HELMETS. THE FAIR BOARD HIGHLY RECOMMENDS YOUTH HORSE SHOW PARTICIPANTS WEAR HELMETS AT ALL TIMES WHEN ON A HORSE.**
- Animals must be humanely cared for and fed by 9 a.m. or an exhibitor will face **POSSIBLE EVICTION AND PENALTY. THIS INCLUDES PROPER CLEANING OF STALLS ON A REGULAR BASIS.**
- Complaints must be filed with the Horse Superintendent within 24 hours of occurrence.
- A County Horse Advisory Council has been appointed to hear grievances and make rulings on situations not covered by the premium list. Said Council will meet as necessary at the 4-H Horse Barn Office to hear any grievances. The Fair Board, however, reserves the right to make final decisions.
- Failure to abide by rules and regulations may subject the exhibitor to eviction from the fairgrounds and loss of premium money. Any dismissal or eviction from a class will result in a loss of premium for that class.
- The Youth Show will be held on Friday, August 25, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. The Danish System of judging will be used. See Dept. VIII – Livestock Youth. The Youth Horse Show is governed by Gogebic County Horse Council Rules. Youth participating in the Youth Show on Friday must have their horses on display for the duration of the Fair (Thursday by 6:00 p.m. thru Sunday at 7:00 p.m.)
- The Open Horse Show performance classes will be held on Saturday, August 26, 2017 beginning at 9:00 a.m. with the Action Games to be held on Sunday, August 27, 2017 beginning at 9:00 a.m. for the Costume class followed by Speed Classes. This will be judged by the numerical system. Rosettes will be awarded. Participation in the Open Horse Show is **not** restricted. The Horse Show is governed by Gogebic County Horse Council Rules.
- Exhibitors who have their horses on display for the entire Fair (Thursday by 6:00 p.m. through Sunday at 7:00 p.m.) **will not** be required to pay class fees for the Open Horse Show.
- Pony and mini size is 56" or less. Registered ponies and mini's must fit the size requirements for their breed.
- Proof of current negative Coggins test will be required on all horses with the exception of a nursing foal. Out of state horses must have an inter-state health certificate.
- Tiny Tot Class exhibitors must be under age 10 (as of January 1st of current year) and exhibit only in Tiny Tot Classes.
- Walk-Trot Pleasure class is for the **beginning horse** who has never been shown in a canter class before. Walk-Trot Equitation (Horsemanship) is for the **beginning rider** who has never shown in a canter class. A Walk-Trot participant is limited to winning 1st place in the "Open Show" for a limit of 2 yrs. You may participate in this class after you have won twice, but you will not be placed in the class. Special needs riders are exempt from the 2 yr. limit. Walk-Trot participants in the Youth Show on Friday are expected to be Walk-Trot participants for **the entire** Fair.
- Walk-Trot exhibitors who enter a Walk-Trot Horsemanship (Equitation) class may not enter any other canter performance classes. Any Walk-Trot exhibitor/horse combination who enters a Walk-Trot Pleasure class may not enter any other canter performance class (not including speed).
- Special needs exhibitors are strongly recommended to wear a helmet at all times when handling a horse.

Please check at the horse registration area as to the order of the classes. Class order is always subject to change. If the change will affect any exhibitor, they will be notified of the change. Every effort will be made to accommodate all exhibitors; however, the show will need to keep moving ahead. Exhibitors should be advised that if a conflict arises, classes may be missed.

### RULES FOR GOGEBIC COUNTY FAIR MODEL SHOW

- Horse Halter classes will be shown with no tack or a halter only. Halter will be judged on conformation, breed characteristics, correctness, quality of markings, and condition of the model.
- Other Animal Classes may be shown as an individual model or in a scene.
- Performance classes (horses) will be judged on suitability of the horse to the event, correctness of tack, authenticity of props, accuracy of the entry, attention to detail, and originality. Performance entries may have cards describing the entry. Performance classes may or may not have a rider.
- Other Model Scenes will include any models you choose to make a scene from. They do not need to be animals. (ex. tractors, cars, dolls). They purpose of this class is creativity in the making of the scene. Cards describing the scene are permitted.
- Model scenes can only be exhibited one year. The models may be used in a different scene another year.
- Ribbons will be awarded by the Danish system (1st, 2nd, 3rd) for youth classes and adult classes will be placed 1st through 5th place.
- Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes will be awarded in Youth and Adult Classes in Halter, Other Animals, Performance Classes, and Other Model Scenes.
- The Model Show will be open to youth and adults.
- Entries must be brought to the fair on Thursday, 10 A.M. to 8 P.M. Judging will take place Friday. Exhibits will be released Sunday at 7:00 p.m.
- For the safety of the models, all models will be displayed in an area where fairgoers will not be able to handle them.

Michigan horses are required to have a current original negative Coggins paper. (not a copy) Out-of-state horses must present an original negative Coggins and a current state health certificate. If you live in Michigan, but your horse is stabled in Wisconsin, you will need a current health certificate along with current negative Coggins. Please make sure that your "out of state" horse has been tested properly and has all of the needed paperwork prior to unloading.

All exhibitors must have these papers readily available for inspection by the State Veterinarian at any time throughout the fair. Remember, NO COPIES OF ANY HEALTH PAPER WILL BE ACCEPTED. 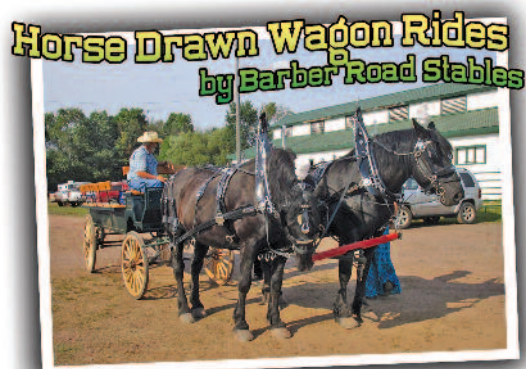
## Marty's Goldenaires performs Thursday

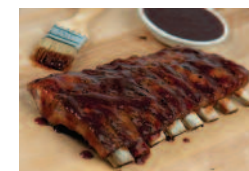

1. Entry day for livestock is Thursday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
2. Dairy, beef cattle, and horses in open and youth classes will be open to exhibitors from any area of residence.
3. All livestock must be owned by the exhibitor or you must send proof to the Gogebic County Extension Office by August 1st to show proof that you had daily access to the animal for at least thirty days before the fair with the exception of the Master Showmanship class.
4. Livestock must remain in place until 7 p.m. the last day of the fair.
5. Livestock exhibitors must provide their own bedding and feed. Packaged bedding will be available for sale at the fairgrounds.
6. Judging will start at 8 a. m. Friday. Youth classes first.
7. Judges will have full power to award places and reject unworthy entries.
8. All exhibitors are responsible for getting their entries to the show ring at the proper time.
9. With the exception of all championship classes, all premiums will be paid by the Danish system for youth classes.
10. Dairy cattle will show as purebred (registered or able to be) or grade. Beef cattle will show as purebred (registered or able to be) or commercial.
11. Each breed will be judged according to the recognized characteristics of that breed. Placing of each class will be based on breed character, quality, balance, and style.
12. Animals will be judged in the show ring unless the judge rules otherwise.
13. All cattle must be dehorned except for those belonging to a breed that recognizes horns as a characteristic of that breed.
14. Youth may only show an uncastrated male under one year old.
15. Tiny Tot youth are under 6 years old as of 12/31 of the fair year. They must have a parent or legal guardian in the show ring with them and can not show with any other age groups.

# GOGEBIC COUNTY 4H MARKET ANIMAL PROJECT

## 2016-2017 RULES & REGULATIONS

- Animals must be owned and exhibited by youth enrolled in the Gogebic County 4-H Market Livestock Project. The \$10.00 4-H participation fee must be paid by January 1st, 2017. Youth must be a current resident of Gogebic County as January 1st of the project year. The animal must be raised in Gogebic County after the official weigh-in.
- Each participant will keep a record sheet to be entered with the market livestock project. Record sheet shall be kept from day of purchase or at the time the participant begins feeding, caring for and preparing the animal for sale. Livestock record sheet must be posted by the animal by 8:00 a.m. Friday. Additional record books are optional and must be turned in to the clerk by 6:00 p.m. on Thursday.
- All market animals must meet state health standards for show and slaughter.
- An animal on medication may be entered for sale if a licensed veterinarian states that the animal is salable and can be slaughtered within 30 days. An animal with drug residue will be cleared with a vet stating that the residue will be eliminated within 30 days. This will be announced at the sale.
- Growth promotional implants or chemicals may not be used for market animals. The Advisory Board will pay for veterinarians testing only for animals in question. Animals testing positive will be eliminated from the sale.
- Entries in this program must be sold at the Market Livestock Auction. All animals will be sold by the pound (including poultry).
- Market Animal Project members can raise up to two of each of the market animals species that will be weighed and identified on the designated dates. If members so choose to raise more than one species, members will attend a meeting held the Monday evening prior to the fair and choose which two species they will be entering in the Market Animal Project (only one entry per species). First and second year members can only sell one animal or one pen of poultry at the fair. Third year members can sell any two species (cannot be two of the same). Third year members must be a minimum of 11 years old as of January 1st of the project year.
- Sale order will be according to the placing of the judge.
- Each participant will raise and care his/her market animal within the practices of good husbandry.
- Weigh-in is on entry day at 6:00 p.m. Youth must be present unless pre-approved by the leaders at the Monday meeting prior to the fair.
- Each participant may have one bid to keep his/her market animal. This bid must be submitted to the auctioneer prior to the auction. They will be required to pay sale expenses if they should take the animal home.
- Buyers will make checks payable to "4-H Market Sale" and after all expenses are paid, a check will be issued to the member in approximately 4 weeks.
- The 4-H Market Livestock Advisory Board will hear grievances and make rulings on these rules. All grievances must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Advisory Board as they arise.
- The Advisory Board collectively reserves the right to periodically inspect the Market Animal Project. If need be a phone poll of the majority of the Advisory Board members may be taken, with a minimum of 3 members of the Advisory Board to inspect.**
- Members of the Gogebic County 4-H Market Animal Club must attend scheduled meetings: 6 meetings if raising one species, or 8 meetings if raising two species.** Any member wishing to make-up a meeting must contact the 4-H Market Animal Advisory Board prior to July 1, 2017. In addition, each member must attend 3 organized workbees. Members not meeting active membership requirements will be disqualified from the auction.
- If a member's animal is uncontrollable, the judges, in conjunction with the livestock clerks can eliminate the animal from the show. The animal will automatically take the bottom spot at the auction for that species. The livestock clerk will determine if an animal needs to be confined or tied during the auction.
- Youth will not receive his/her check until they have picked up and delivered buyers pictures and a thank you. 4H staff and/or advisory board members will be calling all/some of the buyers to check that the youth have fulfilled their responsibilities.
- Youth are required to be present during the judging of their market animal in order to be able to sell it at the auction.
- If an animal does not meet project requirements, a sign stating "animal not for sale at auction" and unmet rule number will be posted. **The club asked that these animals not be sold until after the auction.**
- After weigh-in, each member will be allowed to exhibit only 1 animal or 1 pen of poultry of their designated specie(s) in the market animal aisle.
- Only Auctioned livestock will be provided transportation to, a club approved, slaughter house.**

The Michigan Department of Agriculture will have 60 days to investigate the appeal and issue a report on the findings.

Complaints may not be made regarding judging results.

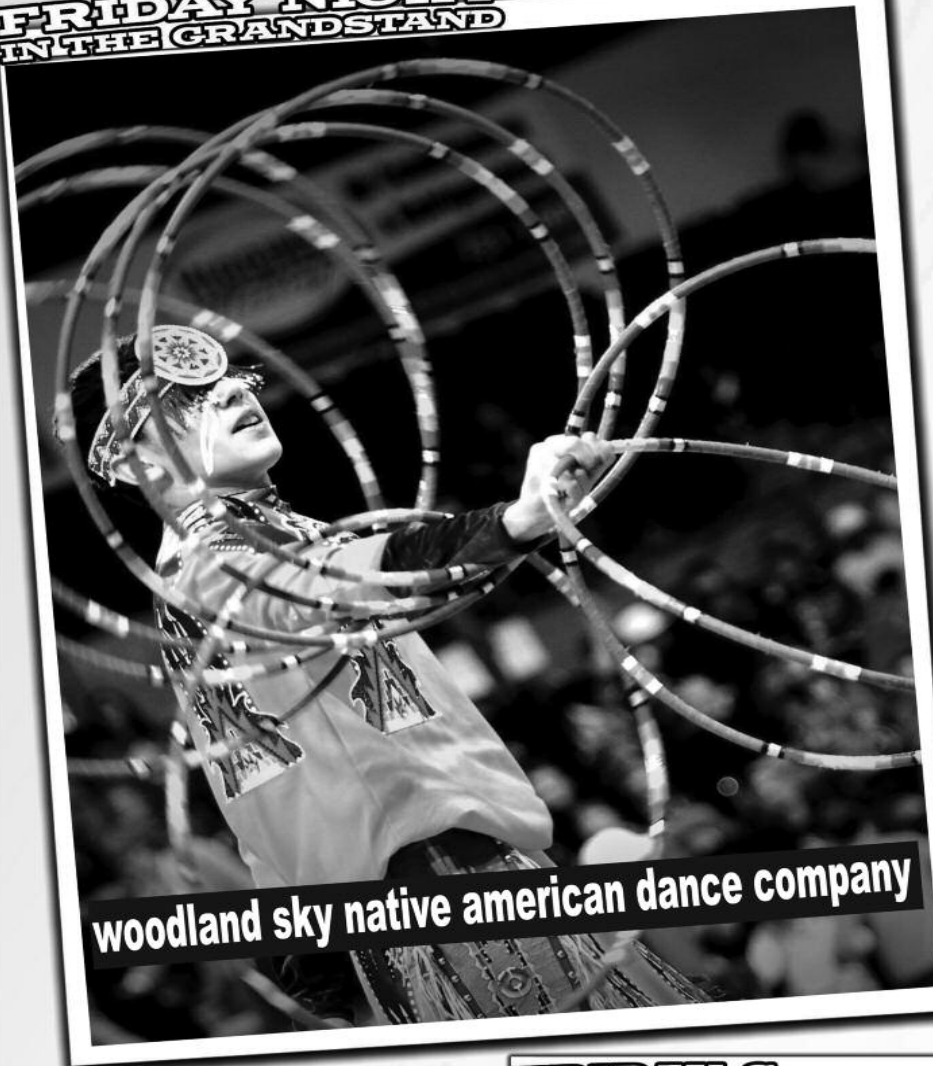

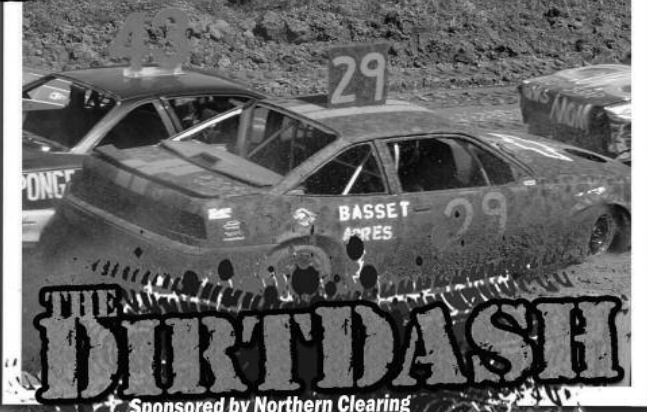
