Dear Parents,

One of the most important skills our children learn is reading. We all want our children to develop good reading habits. Reading, like other skills requires practice. School cannot provide enough practice alone. Your help is needed, as well.

Pick A Reading Partner, better known as PARP, is a program that asks partners to read with their children for at least fifteen minutes daily. The goal of PARP is to foster a child's love for reading. Fifteen minutes a day can make a big difference in your child's attitude towards reading. It exposes your child to new vocabulary, helps in comprehension, and introduces your child to new ideas, new places, and new things. It is one of the most important things you can do for your child.

The choice of reading materials can vary from books to anything with printed words. The daily activity of reading together strengthens reading and communication skills in the child and also the partner/child relationship.

Partners can be parents, grandparents, older siblings and family friends that are able to devote 15 minutes or longer to read with your child. Your child can read to them or their partner can read to them.

Along with this letter your family has been given the following:

- 1. **Reading Contract**: This contract should be signed by your child and his reading partner. Once signed the contract should be return to your child's teacher.
- 2. **Book:** Every Signal Hill Student will receive one free book courtesy of the Signal Hill PTA. This book can be used for PARP activities or your child may choose to read other material during PARP.
- 3. **Calendar & Log**: Everyday that your child and their partner read together please log in the information on the calendar and sign. On Friday January 25th please have your child return the completed logs to their teacher for a prize.
- 4. Activity Sheets: Provides you information about the activities your child will participate in during PARP. This activity sheet also offers additional activities that your family can do during PARP.

We hope you and your family have fun participating in PARP


