- Encourage your child to wonder about things. For example, "Why is the sky blue?" Together, find answers to questions.

- Ask your child about their opinion on interesting subjects. What information does she/he know (or can find out) to support his/her views?
- See daily activities as opportunities to learn. Before you go to the grocery store, for example, discuss how much you can spend. Then use math to stay within your budget.

We try to make fundraisers positive experiences for our students, whether they are geared toward social events, learning opportunities, understanding the value in giving, or increasing independence. Because we incorporate a learning experience in each of the fundraisers, we often don't make a significant monetary profit. Yet the benefits provided to our children are ongoing and enhance their experiences at Paumanok.

What is PNO?

PNO is our biggest fundraiser event of the year, and the funds raised go towards all the amazing Arts & Education programs the PTA provides, including monthly assemblies, Back-to-School Picnic, Fall Festival, Field Day, and Goldilocks Trials.

Why doesn't the PTA post photos?

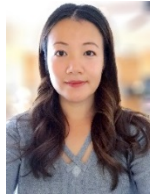

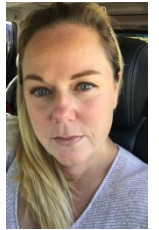
