Presentation Summary:

All too often, decisions are made to modify the curricular expectations for students with LDs because they don't seem to be able to access their age/grade curriculum. . .but students with LDs are bright and they have the *right* to access age/grade level curriculum, with the appropriate accommodations. Modifying curriculum may have cumulative and negative long-term implications for students with LDs.

So do you modify curriculum? Or do you just focus on accommodations? Come participate in this interactive presentation that will explore the *modification vs. accommodation* debate, discuss when and how to modify the curriculum, and review the accommodations students with LDs need to access the curriculum and to demonstrate their learning.
