From the Dockmaster



Merry Christmas to you all! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday and are looking forward to a new year.

I would like to invite you all to see the newly (and almost complete) pier section of A Dock. Many of our club members have been hard at

work to complete this project. We should see its completion soon, all we are wanting is the work being performed by the electricians to be moved along enough to allow us to finish the last section that touches the land. Norbert, Randy, Stanley, My father-in-law Tommy and even person showing interest in joining our club Ches Garner helped pitch in to make this work possible. If I missed anyone's name who helped I apologize.

I would like to let you know I walked the dock and a few boats were hanging on their lines. Suspended by the dolphin poles is a terrible way to lose a cleat (Not that there are good ways to lose one, but some have better stories than hang from the rigging). So it may be advisable to rig you boat so it can rise and fall with the pool level. What is a good way you may ask, well I am glad you did. One way is to loop a line around the pole with a large loop that can go up and down with the rise and fall of the water level. You may even consider adding something like a hose section to protect the line from chafe and maybe, if the hose section is not tight on the line, act as a roller. My boat has two cleats on the rear quarter that I connect the line to one, wrap it around the pole, then connect it back to the second cleat to complete the loop. My line has a section of hose and a knot on each end of the hose section to ensure it stay put on the line where I want it to protect it from the pole.






