As we sat at church, I thoroughly explained Biblical salvation. She told me that according to the Bible she had been saved, but was not live according to her salvation. We then talked with her about her life. Unfortunately, she allowed sin to consume her life. We prayed on the altar and I heard one of the sweetest prayers of repentance that I have ever heard. She bathed the altar with her tears as she asked the Lord to forgive her. She has been to almost every service since and weeps many times through the messages. We are seeing her transform from an ungodly woman to a Godly mother. The last week of March we had a church and youth conference. We were praying for revival and I believed the Lord helped the people greatly. We had a record attendance and averaged 120 people each night. The conference was about allowing the Holy Spirit to build your life. There was much preaching against the flesh and worldliness, but every message was well received. It was obvious that the Lord was dealing with the hearts of the people and Sunday morning (during the fourth service) the altar was flooded with Christians praying and seeking the Lord. Even though that service was two hours long, there were people in the church talking, counseling, and praying for an hour and forty-five minutes after the services ended. We praise God for His work.

We were honored to have Pastor Staub and the members of Silvery Lane Baptist Church of Dearborn Heights, MI, and Pastor Perry of Victory Baptist Church of Bloomsburg, PA, visit Brazil and our family in April. This was so refreshing and encouraging to have folks from the U.S. We were able to show them the great need for the Gospel, and we were also able to show them the need for prayer as we had guns drawn on us while we were traveling.

We took hammocks and slept in screened in dorms. The first night the men's dorm caught fire, but was quickly extinguished. While it was primitive, in the middle of nowhere, and hot, the preaching was good and we had an awesome adventure. Besides the, rats, bats, and poisonous caterpillars, we believed we were accepted by the Brazilians and as being Brazilian during this conference. We have prayed for ten years, "Lord, help us become Brazilians." We all still have a long ways to go, but being accepted helps encourage us to continue. We are now scheduling meetings for our furlough. Our tickets have been purchased and we will be arriving in the

U.S. on June 5, 2018. We plan to be in the U.S. for a year.
