Senator Greg Steube (D) Legislative Update 2018

The following is the 2018 Legislation session that has been approved by Governor Rick Scott and codified into law.

Governor Rick Scott signed **SB 1576 – Animal Welfare**, as known as "Ponce's Law" into law. This piece of legislation will help to improve animal welfare and safety.

SB 100 Veterans Drivers License Fees

Removes fees for Veterans who want the "V" designation on their drivers license. This also exempts Veterans and low income individuals from the business rent tax.

SB 152 Firearm Dealer Payments

Allows firearm dealers to make payments electronically. This would allow the department of law enforcement to provide additional payment options to licensed fire arm dealers, importers, and manufacturers when paying for mandated criminal history record checks.

SB 168 NON-Native Animals

Add lion fish and others as "invasive species". There are more than 500 fish and wildlife non-native species in Florida. The goal of the program is to examine the benefits of strategically deployed and trained private contractors to slow the advance and contain the population and or eradicate them from the state.

SB 310 Threats to Kill or Do Bodily Injury

A separate and stand alone bill in response to Parkland. The bill prohibits a person from making a threat to kill or do bodily harm in writing, including electronic record posting or transmitting that would allow another person to view the threat and would make it punishable as a third degree felony. (Online threats through social media)

SB 858 Daylight Savings Time

Aka "The Sunshine Protection Act" asks Congress to make DST permanent time and if passed by Congress, Florida will stay in DST year round.

SB 1576 Animal Welfare

Requires animal shelters to have a plan to return lost pets to their owners. In 2017 Hurricane Irma resulted in hundreds of lost or stray animals across Florida, putting an added strain on families and shelters. This plan also prohibits a person convicted of animal cruelty from ever owning an animal again.

This concludes all of Greg Steube's passed legislation in the 2018 session. All bills are on the internet or can be viewed on the Senators website.
