

STUDY GUIDE (DO IT YOURSELF!)

NO NEED TO SEND ME YOUR STUDY GUIDE—IT IS FOR YOUR EYES ONLY!

Students have a tendency to think that a study guide allows them to skip some “unimportant stuff” from the assigned readings. Well, I consider ALL sentences from your book to be important, so study EVERYTHING. However, you should ORGANIZE your study according to the STUDY GUIDE. The study guide in my class does not give you a green light to skip some parts; instead, the study guide helps you ORGANIZE your studying of EVERYTHING in the book.

YOU shall create a study guide like this: take ALL headings, ALL subheadings and ALL key terms from the chapters I assigned—and that’s your study guide! Even by merely creating the study guide on your own, you will learn something too, that’s why I am not going to create one for you, since I want you to actively learn.

Let me give you an EXAMPLE about how to create the study guide on your own for each assigned reading: Consider your textbook the Chapter 1, and look at pages 1-2. Your study guide shall look like this: BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS IN DETAILS EVERYTHING LISTED BELOW:

TYPES OF BEHAVIOR

- Verbal behavior
- Non-verbal behavior

- Physiological reactions

Be prepared to discuss in detail everything listed above. You will notice that the only thing I did is COPIED AND PASTED headings, subheadings, and key terms—that approach will give you a good ORGANIZATION for your studying. You can do the rest of your study guides ON YOUR OWN by following what I did, so I recommend that you do it for every assigned page!
