Our story and who we are ...

Big Local Eastern Sheppey (BLES) is one of 150 areas nationally that has been given one million pounds to improve the area for the benefit of its residents. This money is to make a massive and lasting positive difference to our community. Big Local brings together all the local talent, ambitions, skills and energy individuals, groups and organisations who want to make their area an even better place to live!



BLES has been established since August 2014 and each year we have been consulting with local residents about what we can do with the one million pounds for Eastern Sheppey.

During our consultation process in 2018, it became clear that our original vision was not understood by many residents and did not resonate with people locally. The Partnership decided to revise the vision at their plan review day in July 2018. The new vision is meant to be clearer and is based on what local residents said during the consultation:





"Eastern Sheppey by 2026 will be clean, safe, attractive and welcoming; known for its natural beauty and history, where residents and visitors alike feel included and residents are happy and proud to call it home"

Our plan

Throughout our consultation we managed to reach a large proportion of the community and even targeted particular groups of people to ensure that everyone's voices were heard. All of the community suggestions were put into a survey and was available for all local residents to have their input. - ⇒ Small capital items, e.g: equipment that will be available to and of use to residents' on a continuing basis.



The fund is open for bids all year, subject to terms and conditions.



The maximum grant for any one project is £500


Environmental Community Chest

One of our new and exciting projects is our Environmental Community Chest programme that is designed specifically to target environmental improvements. We believe that looking after our neighbourhoods can have a real impact on the quality of life of the people who live there. This environmental fund is therefore dedicated to improving the local environment, whether that means turning a piece of wasteland into a garden or organising a litter picking day on the beach. We look to fund projects that improve the physical environment in a way that also benefits the wider community. We offer grants of up to $\pounds 2,000$. Organisations may only apply once per calendar year for this grant. All projects must deliver a real benefit to the environment. Priority will be given to projects that also include one or more of the following:

- Improve the local environment in Eastern Sheppey
- Involvement of the local community
- Delivers a sustainable and measurable difference
- Supports people in need

New mental health help for Eastern Sheppey residents

One in four islanders will struggle with mental health this year. Two charitable organisations are aiming to get more support in place for those who are going through a difficult time.

<u>Porchlight</u> and <u>Big Local Eastern Sheppey</u> will be offering free mental health & wellbeing training and awareness-raising sessions for individuals, local groups and organisations, starting in the spring.

"A quarter of people on Sheppey will struggle with their mental health but despite this, many people incorrectly believe it won't affect them or anyone they know," explains Porchlight's Chris Thomas.

"We're committed to shining a light on mental health issues so more people can get the support they need. The more we talk about how they're feeling, the easier it is to make sure they receive support and understanding."


