

We want the children and adults who read our books to feel as if they are soaring with that bird, looking down on new lands, seeing the world from a new perspective.

Flyaway Books will be penned by a varied group of authors and illustrators, from beginners to experienced writers and artists. Our titles will be intentionally multicultural in their artwork and characters. They will carry themes of diversity, inclusion, self-esteem, kindness, compassion, and care for our world. Many of them will help children understand today's most pressing social issues. Some will retell familiar religious stories in new ways, while others will carry universal themes appropriate for those from any, or no, religious background.

Many of our books will be appropriate for use in public and private schools, school and public libraries, and bookstores. Others will be aimed at church communities in mainline, emergent, progressive evangelical, and similar traditions.


Though Flyaway Books is new, the imprint is supported by the staff and resources of Westminster John Knox Press, a publisher with more than 175 years of history.

Our first book was named a selection of the Junior Library Guild. Siska Goeminne is a full-time author of numerous books for children and youth. She lives in Leuven, Belgium.


