## A PROVERB A DAY IN BIBLICAL HEBREW

COMPILED AND EDITED BY JONATHAN G. KLINE

Many of the sayings in the biblical book of Proverbs are difficult to read in Hebrew, even for those who know this language well. *A Proverb a Day in Biblical Hebrew* is designed to help readers of all levels of Hebrew competence meditate on and understand the concise and sometimes enigmatic sayings found in the book of Proverbs.

Each verse is presented on one page, which is marked with a day number (from 1 to 365) and a date (January 1 to December 31) so the book can be used as a daily reader or devotional. On each day's page, the verse for the day is divided into two halves, based on the fact that each of the proverbs in the book constitutes a poetic couplet consisting of two parts. After each poetic line, all the words it contains are laid out and glosses are provided. All verbs (including participles) are fully parsed. Finally, at the bottom of the page, an English translation of the verse from two pages earlier is provided. This allows readers who are struggling with the meaning of a given day's proverb, or those who wish to see one possible way it can be rendered, to flip the page and see a translation for it at the bottom of the next two-page spread. In this way, readers can choose to avail themselves of an "answer key" for any of the proverbs when they wish to, but they can also ignore this information (since it is located on the next two-page spread, there is no risk of accidentally seeing it while trying to puzzle through a proverb's meaning).

*A Proverb a Day in Biblical Hebrew* helps readers who have studied Hebrew access the original text of a fascinating and well-loved portion of the Hebrew Bible. It offers readers a simultaneously academic and spiritual experience, walking them slowly and on a regular basis through difficult and enigmatic sayings that invite contemplative reading and sustained reflection.

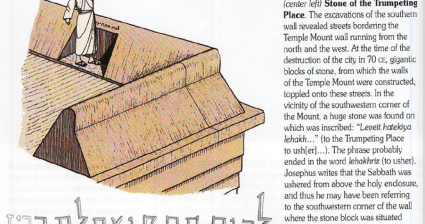

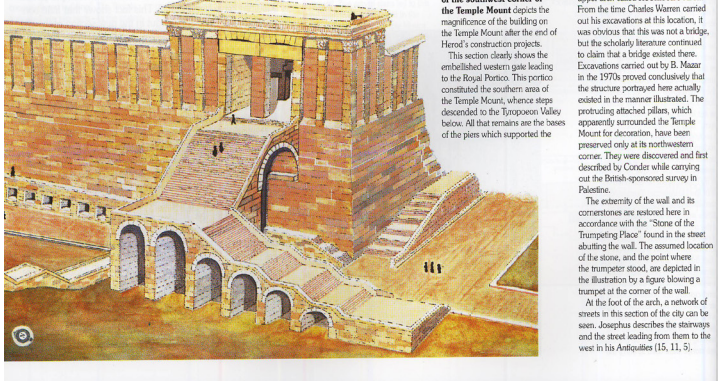
junction. The northern section was typical of the style found in other Hellenistic sites; the style of the southern section was typically Herodian. It may well be that the "seam" was the point where the Hasmonean structure merged with Herod's expansion. However, this explanation is not accepted by many scholars, and there are those who believe that the seam was the meeting point between the Acra—the fortress built by the Seleucids in Jerusalem—and the expansion carried out during Herod's rule.

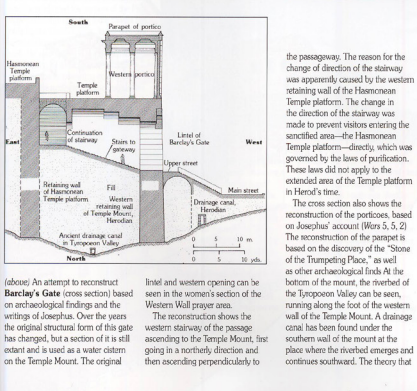


(center left) Stone of the Trumpeting Place. The excavations of the southern wall revealed assets bordering the Temple Mount wall running from the north and the west.

29 In Herod's time the custom of erecting temples for Caesar-worship was already popular. Temples of this type, called Caesareum (plural Caesarea), were generally large compounds in the center of which was the temple surrounded by a portico.

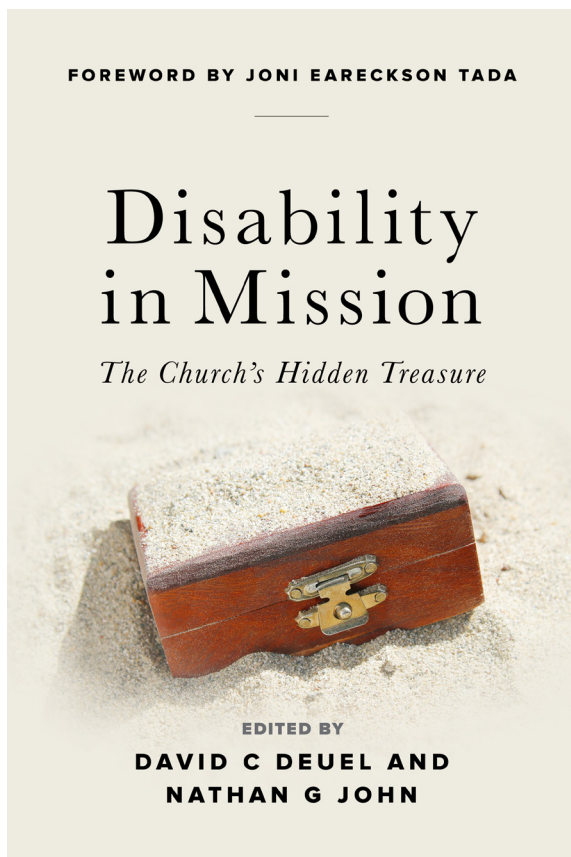
(above and left) Remains of Robinson's Arch found in the Temple Mount wall, in the southern section of the Western Wall. The arch is named after the explorer Edward Robinson, who first described the course below it which also protrudes from the wall.

(above right) Theodotus, son of Vettion, priest and head of the synagogue, was also the son of the head of the synagogue, built the synagogue for the wedding of the Law and for the study of the precepts, as well as the hospice and the chambers and the bathing establishment, for lodging those who need them, from above; if the synagogue was founded by his ancestors and the elders and Simonides.

This inscription was written in Greek and the style of its characters dates it to the time of Herod. This is evidence that synagogues existed in Jerusalem at the time when the Temple was still standing.

The inscription was found in a large cistern during the excavations carried out by R. Wallis in 1913-1914. The cistern contained many architectural remains of a nearby building that had been demolished. It appears that the structure was of outstanding splendor, as evidenced by the decorated pilars and stone blocks found in the cistern. The building was probably demolished at the time of the destruction of the Second Temple, and its remains cast into the cistern, perhaps in the hope that it would someday be rebuilt.

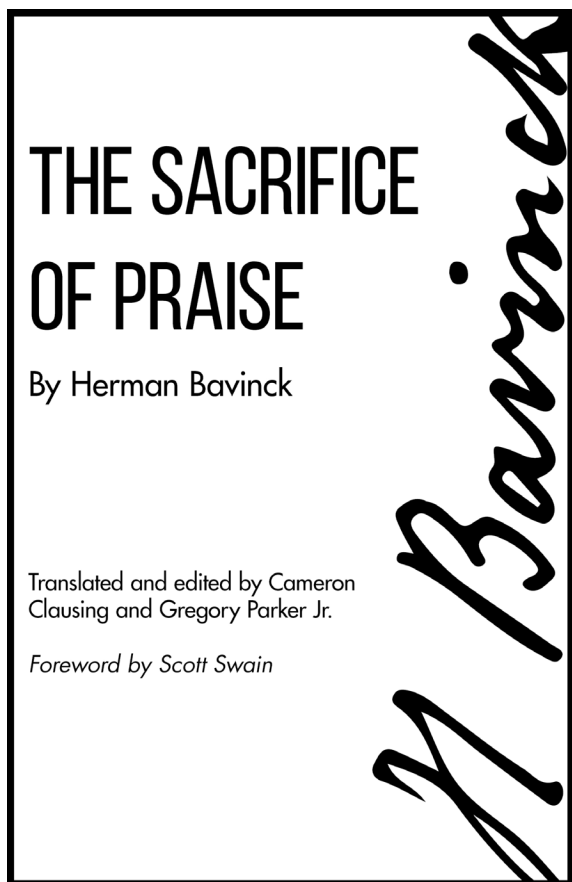

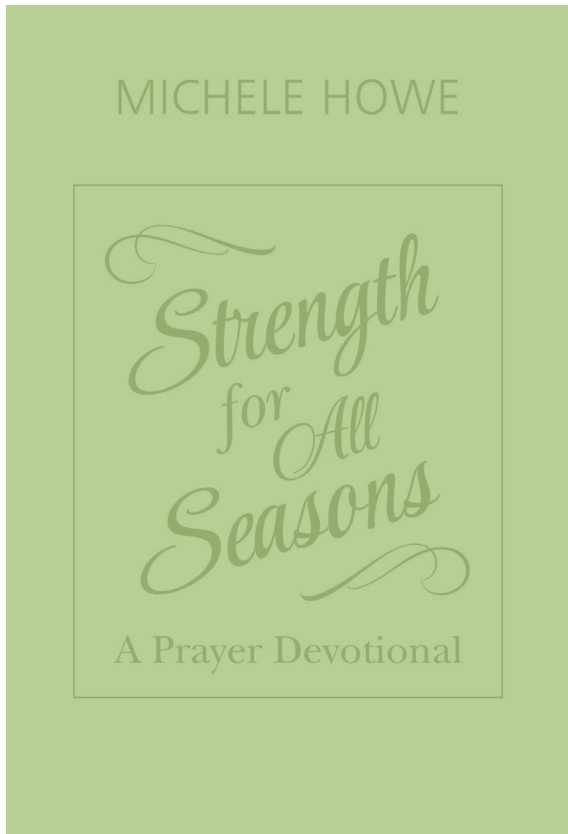

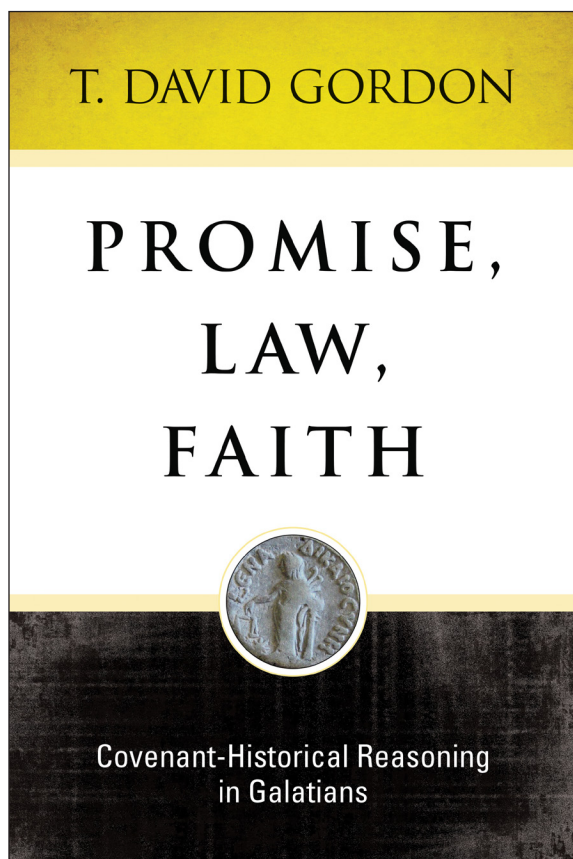

# PROMISE, LAW, FAITH

*Covenant-Historical Reasoning in Galatians*

T. DAVID GORDON

---

In *Promise, Law, Faith*, T. David Gordon argues that Paul uses “promise/ἐπαγγελία,” “law/νόμος,” and “faith/πίστις” in Galatians to denote three covenant-administrations by synecdoche (a figure of speech in which a part is made to represent the whole or vice versa), and that he chose each synecdoche because it characterized the distinctive (but not exclusive) feature of that covenant. For instance, Gordon argues, the Abrahamic covenant was characterized by three remarkable promises made to an aging couple (to have numerous descendants, who would inherit a large, arable land, and the “Seed” of whom would one day bless all the nations of the world); the Sinai covenant was characterized by the many laws given (both originally at Sinai and later in the remainder of the Mosaic corpus); and the New Covenant is characterized by faith in the dying and rising of Christ.

As Gordon’s subtitle suggests, he believes that both the “dominant Protestant approach” to Galatians and the New Perspectives on Paul approach fail to appreciate that Paul’s reasoning in Galatians is *covenant-historical* (this is what Gordon calls perhaps a “Third Perspective on Paul”). In Galatians, Paul is not arguing that one covenant is good and the other bad; rather, he is arguing that the Sinai covenant was only a temporary covenant-administration between the promissory Abrahamic covenant and its ultimate fulfilment in the New Covenant in Jesus. For a specific time, the Sinai covenant isolated the Israelites from the nations to preserve the memory of the Abrahamic promises and to preserve the integrity of his “seed/Seed,” through whom one day the same nations would one day be richly blessed. But once that Seed arrived in Jesus, providing the “grace of repentance” to the Gentiles, it was no longer necessary or proper to segregate them from the descendants of Abraham. Paul’s argument in Galatians is therefore covenant-historical; he corrects misbehaviors (that is, requiring observance of the Mosaic Law) associated with the New Covenant by describing the relation of that New Covenant to the two covenants instituted before it—the Abrahamic and the Sinaitic—hence the covenants of promise, law, and faith. Effectively, Paul argues that the New Covenant is a covenant in its own right that displaces the temporary, Christ-anticipating, Israel-threatening, and Gentile-excluding Sinai covenant.

Randy is married and has two daughters who joined his family through adoption.

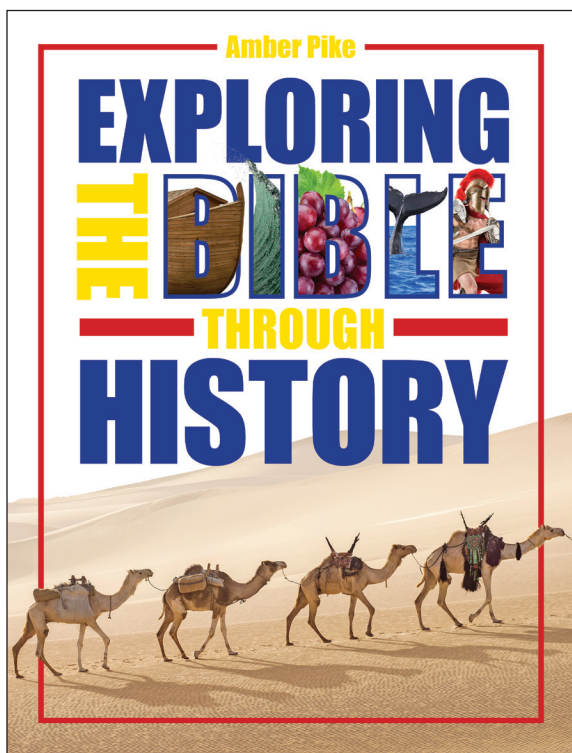
