### Enrichment A – Make-and-Take: Reflections of Sight and Sound

Presenters: Julie Clarke & Donna Brown (Hoschton UMC & Salem Baptist Church)

Donna Brown left the corporate world of Delta Airlines to raise her daughter and is a former pre-school teacher at Salem Baptist Church with a passion for crafting and sewing. # Enrichment B – Mom to 13

Presenter: Meredith Cornish (Prince Avenue Baptist Church)

Meredith and her husband, Michael, are the parents of 13 children, ages 13 months to 16 years old. Six of their kids came to them through birth, and 7 through adoption. Eight of their children have special needs – one biological child, four who came directly from international countries, and three who came through domestic placements. Meredith has spoken in the U.S. and internationally as a special needs advocate and had part of one adoption story published in the book, *Gifts* 2. She homeschools her 10 school-aged kids, advocates for foster care and adoption, and supports other special-needs and adoptive parents.

Meredith will be sharing about her life journey and challenging all of us to see the beauty that God places in EVERY person.

## Enrichment C – LOST Presenter: RaShada Wood (Warren Chapel UMC)

RaShada is a native of Commerce, GA. She is currently a Certified Lay Servant for the North Georgia Conference of the United Methodist Church. RaShada considers herself a student of the word and looks for practical ways to help people apply God's word to their lives. Her passions are sinaina and prayer, and in this season she has been used to minister the word.
