Dr. Jim McAfee, Society president, has recently received the line drawing of his Letters Patent (Coat of Arms) from the Lord Lyon's office. The actual Letters Patent are currently being painted and he will receive them in the next few weeks. As you can see the demi-lion is holding a Celtic cross in the dexter (right) paw signifying his work in the ministry as well as the Macfies being the keeper of the records. In the sinister (left) paw are three arrows representing his three sons and the fact that the Macfies were also warriors. On the upper portion of the shield is the Claymore with a Triquetra on each side. The Triquetra is the Celtic symbol of the Holy Spirit. The lower half of the shield has the Viking style galley. The moto above the demi-lion is in Gaelic and says "Dia Agus Mo Dhuthaich" which translates "For God and My Country." The colored version will be published when received.
