

Samuel Truett Cathy the founder of Chic-fil-A was born in Eatonton, GA, in 1921. He attended Boys High School, now Grady High School, in Atlanta, He served in the U.S. Army during World War II.

Cathy began the chain in an Atlanta suburb , in 1946 with a restaurant called the Dwarf Grill, named because of its small size. It was there that he, along with his brother and business partner, Ben, created the chicken sandwich that later became the signature menu item for Chick-fil-A. The original restaurant, since renamed Dwarf House, is still in operation, and the company operates other Dwarf House locations in the metro Atlanta area. He married Jeanette and had three children: Trudy, Bubba and Dan, who is currently president and CEO of Chick-fil-A.



HOUSTON (KABC) -- Glenn Edward McDuffie, the young sailor who was featured in one of the most iconic photos from the end of World War II, has died. You've certainly seen the photo of McDuffie. He's the sailor grabbing and kissing a nurse in the middle of Times Square after finding out WWII was over. The photo was shot August 14, 1945. McDuffie passed away Sunday, March 9, in Texas at the age of 86. He was positively identified as the sailor in that photo back in 2007 after many men claimed it was them.

McDuffie, a native of Kannapolis, North Carolina, moved to Houston in 1960 and lived here until 2009, when he moved to the Dallas area to spend his last years near his daughter.

2014 Mini-Gathering in New Zealand

It is normal practice to hold a Mini- Gathering at some time during the second

year after the Parliament. All the Clan Societies are encouraged to put in a bid to be the host Society. Only one Society put in a bid at this Parliament. However, there was a slight deviation from the typical proposal. The bid was made by the New Zealand Society, but they asked if the Mini- Gathering could be held in September/ October, 2014. This proposal was accepted by those present at the Parliament. Clan Commissioner for New Zealand, James McPhee, explained that in 2014 the New Zealand Society would be celebrating its thirtieth anniversary. The previous Commander, Sandy McPhie, attended the Society's fifteenth; therefore, it was agreed it would be a good idea to invite the current Commander and his wife Fiona to attend the thirtieth celebration. All Clan members will be welcome to take part in what will be a wonderful event. The Australian Society has kindly invited the Commander and Fiona to extend their visit to the Southern Hemisphere by traveling over the Tasman Sea to spend another three weeks there. It would seem practical and financially sensible to accept the invitation.

Fiona and I are looking forward to the trip, and we hope we will be joined by many others to enjoy the celebration along with our New Zealand and Australian kinfolk.

We will be giving more updates on the Mini-Gathering as plans are further develop.

"The Islands of Colonsay and Oronsay are to become a Native Honeybee Sanctuary" From the Clan Macfie Newsletter

A new law will come into effect January 1st, making it illegal to import any bee other than the Apis mellifera mellifera to the area. The Hebridean islands have about 50 colonies of the species and the new order aims to protect them from cross-breeding and disease. The varroa mite, which has devastated bee colonies across the country, has not affected Colonsay or Oronsay.

There are 250 species of bee in the UK consisting of 24 species of bumblebees, but only one honeybee species, the native Black Bee (Apis mellifera mellifera). The species is much hardier than the Italian Bee (Apis mellifera ligustica), which means the bees can survive the harsh climate of the Inner Hebrides.

The Scottish government granted the order after a public consultation received overwhelming support. The Bee Keeping (Colonsay and Oronsay) Order 2013 is a targeted measure to protect an important population of black bees on Colonsay from hybridization with non-native bees.





Important Happenings from the 2013 Parliament Edited from the Clan Macfie Newsletter

One of the major items discussed and approved at the Parliament was a new, official "Macfie Hunting Tartan." This tartan was designed by Commander Iain. The actual Tartan will have all the required colors and thread counts. The picture to the left is from The House of Edgar, but the official tartan will be a little different from that

May 27th is International Macfie Day. Following the worldwide rallying of Clan Macfie members, by Dr. Earle Douglas MacPhee of Vancouver, BC, the Lord Lyon King of Arms officially recognized the clan on May 27, 1981 as once again being an active clan. In 1993, Clan Macfie met in Parliament of the island of Colonsay for the first time in 370 years. About 129 Macfies, representing Macfie societies around the world, met on the ancestral homeland. Thus May 27th was chosen for Clan Macfie Day by the members attending that Gathering and Parliament meeting.

Mystery Family

Rita Conley writes: Our family was adopted into the McAfee family around 1880. Before that, their name was Smith. Will Smith was born somewhere in Tennessee, we think Nashville or Covington, in 1872 and his sister Nannie was born in Tennessee in 1875.

Mrs. Smith passed away sometime between 1875 and 1880 and so Mr. Smith somehow made his way to Greeley, Colorado where he gave his children to James and Sarah McAfee for adoption.
