

It is VESSEL SAFETY CHECK time again. The VSC is an annual event, and it allows those that avail themselves of the free safety check to be assured they have all the necessary safety equipment on board their vessel. It also ensures items that have an expiration date are not expired and are valid, such as their fire extinguishers and flares. This squadron service is, or course, available to all members of our squadron and is available to the public as well, such as your friends and neighbors. If one boat does not pass, there is no punitive action taken, and it is not reported to any agency. Once the item(s) that needed attention is corrected we will re-visit and re-do the VSC and, when one boat passes, issue the current year safety sticker. Contact P/C Ron Terciak to schedule your VSC.



The government continues to track boating deaths and, according to a recent news release, drowning continues to be a very prevalent occurrence and a very serious problem. I believe we, as members of USPS, and as thinking and rational people, should follow our own advice and teachings and wear a personal floatation device (PFD), a life vest, anytime we are out on the water in our, or anotherøs, boat. We should õleadö by example. With all of the different model PFDøs available, there really is not a good reason to not wear one at all times when on the water in a boat.

While on the subject of setting an example, for those that own a boat, please consider availing yourselves of the free safety inspection of your vessel.



It is a service we gladly offer to members and non-members (for instance your neighbors and friends). We inspect the safety equipment on board your boat and, if everything is as it should be, a Vessel Safety Check sticker is issued and is to be placed on your boat. The inspections can be while the boat is in the water, on a trailer or on a lift. If your boatøs safety equipment is not as it should be, and you do not pass the inspection, no sticker is issued.

It is a win-win situation for the boat owner and for the squadron. Please, seriously consider availing yourself of this free service. Contact **P/C Ron** to schedule your VSC.

A SPECIAL EVENT IS BEING PLANNED

There was a presentation entitled "Local Waters" given by the Southwest Florida Yacht Club. The intent in attending was to glean whatever information we could that would be relative to the local waters educational classes we conduct. The same held true for Cdr. Bob Moro, of the Fort Myers Sail & Power Squadron who also attended. However, we were very pleasantly surprised.

The presentation was given by two VERY experienced boaters, the Yacht Club **Commodore Harvey Steele** and the Yacht Club **Vice Commodore Ron Austin**. These two individuals immediately got our attention and gave an extremely informative presentation.

Their presentation was focused at providing information to boaters about cruising destinations, including:

- Marinas
- Anchorages
- Waterfront Restaurants

For the southwest Florida gulf coast area. Included also was information about boater resources.

They discussed, in detail, marina information and waterfront restaurants from Marco Island/Naples to North Port/Port Charlotte, and beyond. The locations, approaches to them (depth, rocks, channels, etc.), boat slip capacities, how they rated the level of service at the marinas and restaurant slips was discussed in detail. They also included first-hand knowledge of how the restaurants and marinas treated boaters, whether they were helpful or seemingly indifferent to the boaters at their location. They spoke from first-hand knowledge and experience, as they had been to the multitude of locations they discussed many times.

Cdr Moro and I are having discussions with the two speakers to do this presentation for our squadron members, and perhaps the members of all four of the quad-squads. We both agreed all of our members would thoroughly enjoy and benefit from this offering. You will love it and find the information useful and beneficial, regardless if you are a new boater or seasoned and experienced. More information about this will be forthcoming as soon as we have the date this will occur and location it will be held.



Public Classes

Our Public Classes

We offer several classes to increase boater knowledge and skills. These classes are open to the public (membership is not required). The classes are presented as a public service by the Squadron and are taught by experienced Squadron members

America's Boating Course 3rd Edition ®

Is our basic boating class. The class will cover the basics of boat handling, PWCs, required equipment, navigation aids and rules, and dealing with emergencies. It will provide instruction and examination for laws and regulations of the State of Florida. The course is a total of 8 hours spread over two days. Read a detailed description of the course by clicking on "America's Boating Course 3rd Edition".

Local Waters – Local Charts

Is our course for boaters in the Ft. Myers area. The Local Waters class is directed toward new boaters and boaters new to the area, as well as those who wish to learn chart reading. Using Chart 11427, boaters will learn some of the basics of navigation in the Fort Myers Area. Students would bring their own copies of the chart. Read a detailed description of the course by clicking on "Local Waters - Local Chart".

Using GPS

GPS has become a common tool for navigation. However using GPS on the water is distinctly different from a moving map display in your car. This 2-3 hour seminar explains the principles of waypoint navigation which you will use. It then shows you how to use the buttons on your GPS and how to relate the GPS to your charts.

Using VHF & VHF DSC Marine Radios

This class is essential for those with a 'new' radio or those planning to buy a new radio. DSC is operational in Fort Myers. You need to register your radio and learn how it's different. We also cover standard VHF operations. Read a detailed description of the course.

Paddle Smart

This seminar is intended for those interested in Paddle sports or are considering the purchase of a Kayak, Canoe or other Paddle sport equipment. Read a detailed description of this course by clicking on "Paddle Smart".

Hurricanes & Boats

This is a mini-seminar. It covers how to select a location and prepare your boat for a hurricane.

Membership Classes

Member Courses:

We offer our members "Advanced Grade" and "Elective" courses.

Advanced Grade Courses

Five Advanced Grade courses are offered by USPS. They are designed to be taken in sequence because each builds on skills taught in the previous course.

<u>Seamanship</u>

Covers basic deck seamanship, marlinspike (knots and ropes), anchoring and rafting, basic boat care and maintenance, and nautical and USPS customs and etiquette.

Piloting

Is the first and most basic navigation course, covering chart reading, course plotting, and basic coastal or inland navigation, including basic GPS usage. This course goes into more detail than the charting information covered in the public courses.

Course cost: \$75.00 includes "The Weekend Navigator". Course Plotter, Parallel Rules & Dividers are required. Students bring their own.

Advanced Piloting

Covers more advanced coastal navigation techniques, navigation in tides and currents, and more advanced GPS and Rader usage.

Junior Navigation

Teaches the basics of offshore navigation, including basic celestial navigation using the sun and offshore course planning.

Elective Courses

Elective Courses

Six Elective Courses are offered by USPS. They cover separate and independent topics and therefore may be taken in any order according to a memberøs interests and time.

Engine Maintenance

Covers the operating principles and basic care and maintenance of outboard and inboard engines, including diesels. *This course is offered by Cape Coral Power Squadron Course Cost: \$52.00 - \$25.00 deposit upon registration. Date to be announced.*

Marine Electronics

Covers installation and maintenance of both boat electrical systems (AC and DC) and marine electronics (VHF radio, radar, GPS, etc).

Cruise Planning

Covers topics of interest for someone planning a cruise ó whether for just a weekend or for a year ó including preparation and planning, anchoring, security, chartering, and cruising outside the US.

<u>Weather</u>

Covers weather forecasting and reading weather patterns on-board.
