- a host of other mundane but necessary administrative squadron issues as they arose during the summer months.

We tried an experiment over the summer months this year by having two C&R& each month. Based on the participation during the past two years of our having C&R& over the summer, with anywhere from 15-25 members at each event, it was thought this would be a good way to further our camaraderie over the summer in lieu of membership meetings which are suspended for the summer months. This experiment did not have very good results. Perhaps it was because more members than usual were out of town or members were otherwise engaged in other activities. The participation was okay, but did not match past summers in terms of the number of people participating.

We also thought a longer-distance C&R would be well received by the membership. Sometimes our C&Røs are very close thereby not giving the member a decent time for an enjoyable boat ride. We (Steve Mortonson, two friends and me) scouted out a trip to LaBelle in terms of time of travel by boat and whether the restaurant, located a block and a half walk from free dockage in LaBelle, could and would accommodate our needs in terms of group seating and separate bills for each person/couple. After sending out the information to the membership about the proposed C&R to LaBelle we received a very underwhelming response. Perhaps this particular trip could be again proposed but at a different time of year.

The intent this time was to schedule it before the seasonal slow zones went into effect on the Caloosahatchee Waterway and before all the snow birds returned, thus causing a huge increase in boating traffic.

Another destination that would provide a longer-distance boat ride was suggested by **Bob** Shaw. He suggested Millerøs Dockside, which is in the Boca Grande Marina (marker 2, just across Charlotte Harbor along the ICW). We stopped there a couple of years ago when the squadron did an overnight C&R to Palm Island on Cape Haze. It was a lunch stop on the way to Palm Island. It was a good restaurant with plenty of water views and good food. Perhaps we can consider this sometime during the year. We will probably be going to Cape Haze next spring for an overnight C&R which will be in conjunction with another squadron who will join us there. Those plans have not yet been finalized.

A special THANK YOU goes to **John Manos** who, as Assistant Squadron Administrative Officer, filled in for Nancy Chambers, our SAO, while she was out-of-town. John made the calls arranging details for the C&Røs and sending notifications to our membership.

We were able to finalize our initial configuration of investments for our squadron. This was through the firm Edward Jones. Our financial advisor, Eric Tibbs, came to us through one of our long-term and upstanding members and Eric Tibbs guided us to appropriate investments of the õbuilding fundsö that were donated to the squadron many years ago. Initially **Ron Terciak**, **Ken Morris** and **I** worked with Eric Tibbs and a slate of municipal bonds and CD¢s was developed.

That was then discussed in the Executive Committee and, finally, we had Eric Tibbs make a presentation to the Executive Committee. Since the regular interest income from those funds had become non-existent, we had to fulfill our fiduciary responsibility regarding our squadrongs financial health, as we were repeatedly drawing small amounts from the building funds so as to keep our bank balance in the black. Without the interest income, we had realized for several years we were operating at a deficit. The Executive Committee unanimously approved the investment strategy and actions through Edward Jones. We also checked and determined we were within the parameters of recommended procedure as delineated by USPS National.

We were contacted by a representative of the USPS sanctioned Sea Scouts program and when the membership was asked if anyone had an interest in becoming involved in this, should the squadron go forward with hosting a Sea Scout program, two members stepped up. As of this writing we are scheduled to have a meeting with the representative to review the expectations the program would have from our squadron, as well as all the ins and outs about which we need to know. After that meeting, if it is felt this is something that the squadron should seriously consider, and if the two volunteers are in a positive mind-set about the program, this will be discussed in the Executive Committee to obtain approval to move forward, should the committee agree with the information that would be presented.

As most already know our squadron has joined the Fort Myers Beach Chamber of Commerce.

Also, as was previously mentioned in an email message to the membership, a big THANK YOU to Bob Amerine who õfundedö our firstyear membership dues at the Chamber. dues for a charitable organization were recently revised and reduced, thus making it financially possible for our squadron to consider joining. The Chamber sends out a regular news update, which I will be forwarding to the membership. Any of our members can attend and participate in the various functions the Chamber schedules. The õmainö events are usually held on Thursdays. The first Thursday of the month is the Chamber breakfast, held at one of the FMB businesses. The second Thursday of the month is the Chamber luncheon, with a guest speaker which is held at one of the FMB businesses. The third Thursday is an oafter hourso cocktail and appetizerøs, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., held at one of the FMB businesses. Again, any of our members are welcome to attend any or all of the events.

The 2017 fall Fort Myers Boat Show is scheduled for November 16-19, 2017, Thursday through Sunday. It is a quad squad event, with each of the four squadrons (us, Cape Coral, Fort Myers, Sanibel-Captiva) taking a day to staff the booth. Our squadron is scheduled to staff the booth on Friday, November 17, 2017. The show runs from 10:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. that day. __Labor Day is September 4th and according to the U.S. Department of Labor Is " dedicated to the social and economic achievements of the American worker". Oregon was the first state to make it an official holiday and it became a federal holiday in 1894.

One of those groups of workers we celebrate is from the ship and boat building industry. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics there are 136,140 people employed by the industry. Production occupations make up 45.57% of the jobs and their average income is \$44,520. Management employs 5360 people. Their average income is \$125,520 with CEOs earning \$199,650. 8000 engineers comprise 5.88% of employees and include mechanical, electrical, industrial, and marine engineers with technicians such as drafters also included in the category. Administrators, grounds keepers, maintenance workers, and security guards keep things running smoothly and safely for everyone.

Boat building is one of the oldest professions on earth and probably will continue as long as there is water to cross. Although a much smaller industry than pre-WWII it still provides a wide array of occupations.

Put the Power of Facebook to work for your Squadron

The question is often raised "why use Facebook", the squadron newsletter, web page, and email blasts meet our needs for communicating. However; those means of communication are one way (information is posted to be read, dialogue isn't supported) directed toward existing members. Social media such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, allow a squadron to reach outside of its membership and convey information and encourage conversation with both members and potential members.

Facebook is the largest social media tool and is used by individuals, businesses, and non-profit organizations. But really, who uses Facebook? According to a 2016 report published by Hootsuite, 82 percent of 18 to 29-year-olds online use Facebook, 79 percent of 30 to 49-year-olds online use Facebook, and 56 percent of online users ages 65 and up use Facebook. Facebook allows US Power Squadrons to expand their communications to much larger audience, and audience of potential students and members.

Building a successful Facebook presence for local Squadron requires planning, organization, and knowledge of the tools provided by Facebook to properly market your Squadron's educational, boating, and social opportunities. Every member of the local Squadron contributes to the success of the Facebook presence by "Liking" the Squadron page and by interacting with posts (liking a post, commenting on a post, or sharing the post). The interaction with Facebook posts expands the Squadron's reach.

Facebook postings can be simple text posts, pictures, videos, are even live action; they can be informational (a channel marker missing), instructional (a short video on docking), entertaining ("Friday Follies" photos of boating gone wrong), or promotional (benefits of taking a USPS class or becoming a member of USPS).

Learn more about using Facebook to promote the message that USPS is America's Boating Club by participating in the Build A Facebook Page Roundtable at the D22 Fall Conference in Punta Gorda on Saturday, 7 October. Bring your laptops, tablets, and even mobile phones to take part in hands on training on managing a USPS Squadron Facebook page. Topics will include adding admins, page roles, combining several Facebook pages into one, creating events and notes, and Facebook Live.



Cooperative Charting Program

Well this year appears to have been very confusing when it comes to Cooperative Charting. The rumor mill was very active with a wide range of items. The items covered the entire gamut from the program is completely dead, all that National is pushing for is Geodetic Recovery and so

forth. While there is some truth in all the rumors none of them reflect what has or is occurring with the program.

To begin with yes it is true CCWEB no longer is operational. Most of you remember this was our mechanism to file Nautical, Coast Pilot and Chart Discrepancy reports. However there is a system now in place to address these reports. More on that later. The second issue is Geodetic Recovery. Yes the Committee recently restarted this program after many years. Steps are in place to prevent the issues that previously caused the program to be dissolved. The program was restarted in order to give our members something to do even though not directly related to the nautical charts. Many old timers remember the original Recovery program was part of Co-op Charting so it only made sense to keep it there. While there was a big push to get this program restarted it was not the only thing that happening with the program.

Back to the Nautical program. The shutdown of the CCWEB pretty much came as a surprise to the Committee. When it was announced we were pretty much in shock as I can assume the rest of you were. Really after a 50 plus year partnership the program was shutoff? Once the reason was explained there was not much that could be said. There was nothing that we did to cause the issue as it had to do with national security.

Once we got over this shock the Committee went to work to attempt to come up with a way to continue the program. Initially when CCWEB was turned off NOAA had in place a Nautical Discrepancy Reporting System that could be used to report chart discrepancies. The major issue with this system is that it did not allow for any review by the national committee members. In

fact there was no mechanism to inform the District Chairman and Area Reps that a report was submitted. As you can imagine this caused some concern with quality control at the national level. In addition there was no provision to award any type of credits for the information filed. When questioned on this the answer was simply we should report the discrepancies as it is the right thing to do.

Without a lot of boring details the good news we now have a new USPS Nautical Program which is basically a discrepancy / verification reporting system in place The program is fully operational and is explained in detail and is available on our website. The Committee is working with a programing professional to develop a reporting program similar to the old CCWEB program. Until that takes place we have put together a JotForm report for your use. The new system also allows credits to be issued similar to the old system. The credits awarded will be tracked by the Committee and used to recognize individuals, squadrons and district much like before.


Your first step is to review the new Nautical Reporting SOP which can be found at https:// www.usps.org/images/Exec/CoopCh/Docs/2017 30-06 Programs and Reporting.pdf. This SOP should be downloaded and saved for reference. There are many other useful links for this new program. The JotForm link is posted on the website or can also be accessed at https://form.jotform.us/70635965335160. In addition you will find many useful forms for collecting and reporting your information on the website.

I am sure many of you in District 22 are eager to get back on the water and do Co-op Charting so now we have the steps needed to do so. Please take time to download and read the information in the new SOP. I am sure there will be many questions for which you will need answers or assistance. Please feel free to contact me as needed.

Happy Co-op Charting.

America's Boating Course 3rd Edition ®

Using Chart 11427, boaters will learn some of the basics of navigation in the Fort Myers Area. Students would bring their own copies of the chart. Using GPS

GPS has become a common tool for navigation. However, using GPS on the water is distinctly different from a moving map display in your car. This 2-3-hour seminar explains the principles of waypoint navigation which you will use. It then shows you how to use the buttons on your GPS and how to relate the GPS to your charts.

Using VHF & VHF DSC Marine Radios

This class is essential for those with a 'new' radio or those planning to buy a new radio. DSC is operational in Fort Myers. You need to register your radio and learn how it's different. We also cover standard VHF operations. Read a detailed description of the course.

Paddle Smart

This seminar is intended for those interested in Paddle sports or are considering the purchase of a Kayak, Canoe or other Paddle sport equipment. Read a detailed description of this course by clicking on "Paddle Smart".

Hurricanes & Boats

This is a mini-seminar. It covers how to select a location and prepare your boat for a hurricane.

Member Courses:

We offer our members "Advanced Grade" and "Elective" courses.
