Minster Musings Bro. Winfred Frazier We Need Each Other

There is an indelible and universal truth as it pertains to the church. We need each other. The church in Corinth struggled with supremacy. There were those who possessed the most coveted and thereby most respected spiritual gifts, and to those they bestowed greater honor. Within the church, they were considered the most important. To dispel such a divisive notion and to promote unity, Paul makes some assertions. Notice what he says in 1 Corinthians 12:19-22, "And if they were all one member, where would the body be? But now indeed there are many members, yet one body. And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary."

Why? Because truthfully, if we all possessed the same talents, the same abilities, the same strengths and even weaknesses; where would the body be? The answer is simple. It would be lacking what you can contribute whether great or small. You see brethren, the truth of the matter remains indelible. We need each other. Therefore, let us conclude that although you may not be able to do what others can; there is no gift given by God that is not both useful and beneficial to the growth and vitality of this congregation. Essential Health Tips for Seniors

Brand Name Generic Drugs

Can I substitute brand name drugs with generic drugs? The FDA (Food and Drug Administration) has a test called the "bio-equivalence test." Simply put, this test checks whether a generic version of a particular brand name drug is as effective as the brand name drug.

Usually, these differences are negligible but at the same time there are drugs that operate within a narrow spectrum of effectiveness. In this case, switching from a brand name drug to a generic drug may not be advisable.

It has been observed in some patients that substituting brand name drugs with FDA-approved generic drugs may cause minor side-effects. This is the reason why medical professionals are usually not very comfortable with substituting the types of drugs that has been prescribed to patients.

BLACK HISTORY 365-DOROTHY HEIGHT (1912-2010)

Winfred Frazier

James LaCour II.

Dorothy Height, a teacher and social service worker, was the four-decade-long president of the National Council of Negro Women (NCNW). She was called the "godmother of the women's movement" for her work for women's rights. She was one of few women present on the platform at the 1963 March on Washington. In 1986,

Ms. Height became convinced that negative images of black family life was a significant problem, and to address the problem, she founded the annual Black Family Reunion, an annual national festival.

In 1994, President Bill Clinton presented Height with the Medal of Freedom. When Dorothy Height retired from the presidency of the NCNW, she remained chair and president emerita.

Quote: "We are not a problem people; we are a people with problems. We have historic strengths; we have survived because of family."
