

RV's are great, but they are not safe in severe weather. It can occur without much warning. If you are caught in it, it can be disastrous.

So, what do you do? What's your plan?





## Access information and alerts

With a mobile device, get apps for weather information and alerts. Those without a smart phone, I suggest purchasing a weather radio

receiver. Receivers are available at most retailers that sell electronic equipment.



#### Develop an emergency plan

When you arrive at a campground, ask at the check-in desk about an emergency plan in case of a severe storm or make your own. *Always* 

stay on the lowest level possible and away from doors and windows.



#### Your job during emergency

Make sure everybody traveling in the RV *knows exactly* what his or her job is in case of severe weather or other emergencies.



#### Monitor weather alerts

Tune the receiver to the local nearby National Weather Service office. Alerts inform people if they need to take some type of action in order to protect them.



### Brief everybody on plan

Explain to children how to respond to different disasters and the dangers of severe weather. Instruct children on emergency

exits and on how and when to call 911.



#### Emergency supply kit

Your emergency kit should be prepared and easily accessible. Items to add to the kit:

flashlights, batteries, blankets, water, coats, first-aid kit, pet supplies, portable weather radio, manual can opener,

canned food, prescription drugs, and special items for infants, elderly or disabled family members.


