

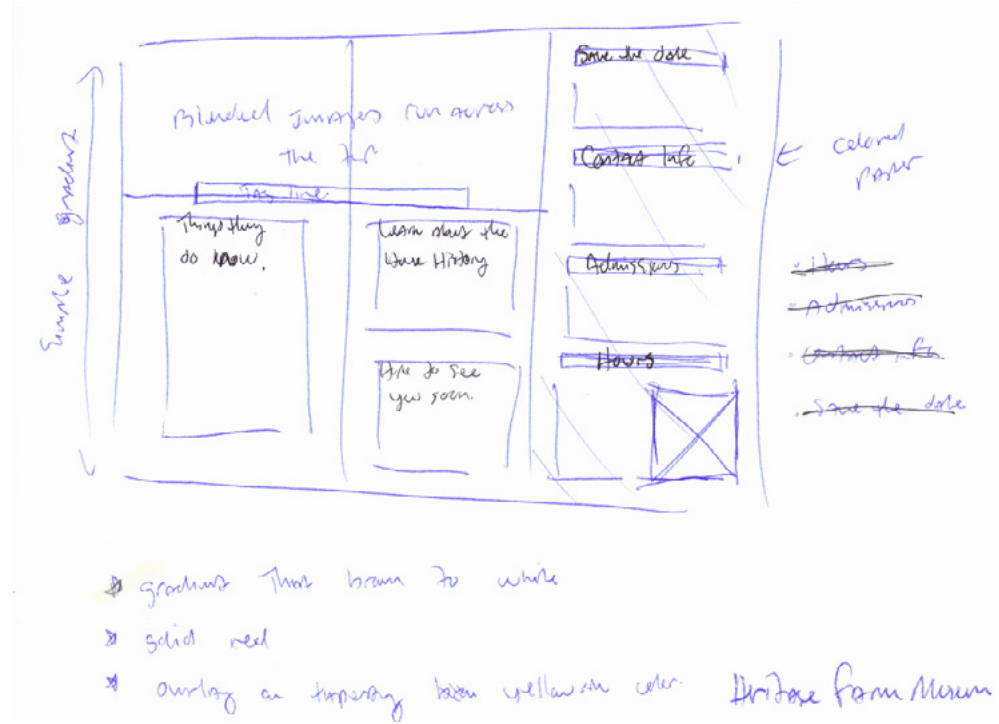
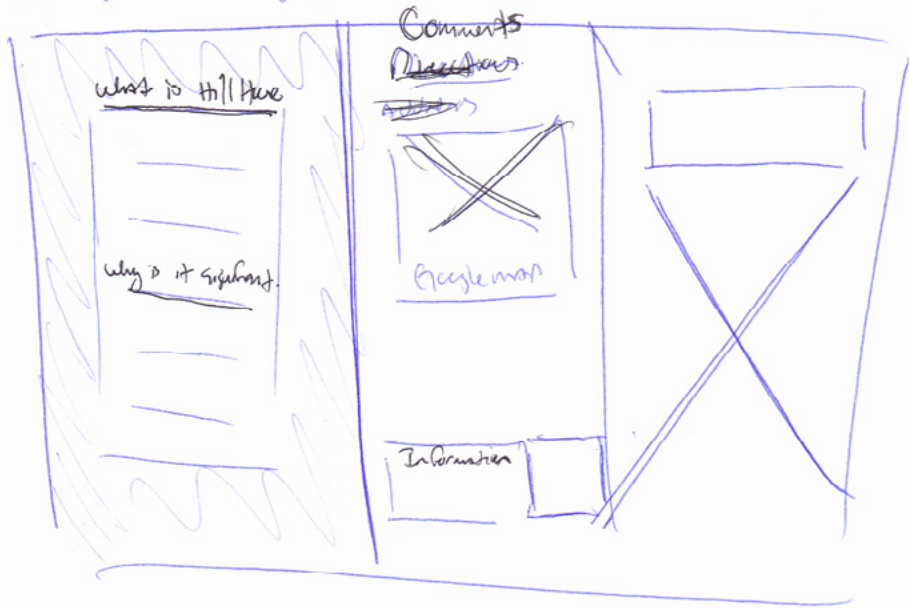

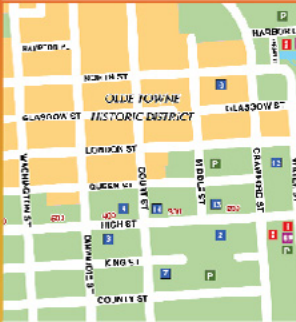
The Hill House Museum, circa 1820, is located in Olde Towne Portsmouth, Virginia. This magnificent home housed three generations of the Hill family.

It was home to three generations of Hills and in the 1960's was left to the PHA by its last occupant, Miss Evelyn Hill. Miss Hill left the contents of the home, which were acquired by all three generations to the PHA as well.

The Hill House Museum was opened to the public in the 1960's but around 2007 was closed due to badly needed restoration and maintenance.

In 2010, initiated by the PHA, there was a renewed effort to restore the home and its gardens to their original grandeur.

- Head east on I-264 E toward Exit 7A
- Take exit 7B toward Downtown/Portsmouth
- Keep left at the fork, follow signs for Crawford St/Downtown Portsmouth and merge onto Pavilion Dr
- Turn left onto Court St
- Turn right onto North St
- Destination will be on the right

### Welcome to Portsmouth

Well over a century ago, ladies in hats and white gloves sipped tea in the garden at 221 North St. These days they still do.

Such teas have become one of the top fund-raisers for the Hill House Museum, a Portsmouth historical gem that not long ago was fading rapidly into decline.

The association does six public teas a year. Private groups like the Virginia Tea Society use the Hill House too.

The Olde Towne Civic League and Portsmouth Master Gardeners took on the house's garden, where most of the teas are held.

In two centuries, the Hill family and their ancestors knew wealth and held leadership positions. And while there were times of struggle, it is the wealth that is evident during tours. The Haviland Limoges china. The silver table centerpiece. Rosewood desks from Italy.

"There are stories from the War of 1812, the Spanish-American War, the Civil War and stories about the yellow fever epidemic," she said.

"I don't think it gets much richer than to be able to tell the whole story of Portsmouth through one house."
