Important News For Our Members

At the September 25 RWCC Executive Board meeting, we voted on a proposed bylaw change to allow the consolidation of the duties of the 3d Vice-President for Membership and Treasurer. The reason is that the Treasurer is responsible for handling the dues and forwarding a list of members to AFRW. The board proposes to delete the position of Vice-President for Membership and give those responsibilities to the Treasurer. We also added the responsibility of appointing a Caring for America Chairman to the President's duties.

We will vote on the change at our October meeting, so please review revised Article IV of the Bylaws below (words lined through will be deleted and words highlighted will be added):

ARTICLE IV Officers and Their Duties

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be: President; First, Second, and Third and a fourth Vice President; Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected for a term of two years, and no officer shall succeed herself more than once. However, a position may be filled with the immediate past office holder only in case no person is available to take the position.

Section 3. Duties of officers.

- a. PRESIDENT:
 - (1) Preside at all meetings of the organization.
 - (2) Appoint all committees.

(3) Be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating

Committee.

(4) Prepare a program of action after consultation with the chairmen of standing committees for presentation to the Board of Directors.

- (5) Appoint a Parliamentarian.
- (6) Appoint a Chaplain.
- (7) Appoint an Americanism Chairman.
- (8) Appoint a Sunshine Chairman.
- (9) Appoint a Caring for America Chairman.
- (10) Co-sign all checks with the Treasurer.

(11) Act as liaison between the organization and the Alabama Federation of Republican Women (AFRW).

(12) Represent the organization at all times or designate someone as representative in her absence.

(b) FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT shall be the Program Chairman. She shall serve in the absence of the President and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President and Board of Directors.

(c) SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT shall be the Membership Chairman, and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President shall be the Hospitality Chairman and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President.

d.THIRD VICE-PRESIDENT shall be the Campaign Activities Chairman and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President.

e.RECORDING SECRETARY shall record and keep the minutes of all meetings of the organization, be custodian of all records and papers of the organization, except those that pertain to some other office or committee, may co-sign all checks along with the President or Treasurer, and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President.

f.CORRESPONDING SECRETARY shall be the club newsletter editor and shall perform such other duties as may be designated by the President.

g.TREASURER shall collect all funds and deposit them in a bank approved by the Board of Directors, co-sign all checks with the President or Secretary, disburse funds as directed by the President and/or Board of Directors, make written reports of receipts and disbursements for all meetings, and as directed by the President, and be an ex-officio member of the Budget Committee. Additionally, the Treasurer shall be in charge of membership and keeping a current roster of all members and filing necessary reports to AFRW.

IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT: The retiring President shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors for a period of two years. The Past President shall be consultant of committees.
