

Q&A

Q: What does Freedom of Expression mean?

A: Freedom of speech is the freedom of an individual or a community to articulate their opinions and ideas without fear of retaliation, censorship, or sanction. The term "freedom of expression" is sometimes used synonymously but includes any act of seeking, receiving, and imparting information or ideas, regardless of the medium used.

Freedom of expression is recognized as a human right under article 19 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) and recognized in international human rights law in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR). Freedom of expression in Canada is not absolute; Section 1

of the Charter allows the government to pass laws that limit free expression so long as the limits are reasonable and can be justified in a free and democratic society.

This can often be the subject of controversy as some feel the conditions for reasonable justification are vague and/or politically manipulative, granting the government an unreasonable amount of control over freedom of expression.

A legal case to refer to: British Columbia Teachers' Federation v. British Columbia (Attorney General), 2009 BCSC 436 (CanLII) where government legislation was found to be unconstitutional.

BILL NO. 38 ELECTORAL SYSTEM REFERENDUM ACT

There are three separate but interrelated purposes, or principles to Bill No. 38. Firstly, to establish the referendum question, secondly to appoint an independent Referendum Commissioner, and thirdly to create, as the bill says "a level playing field" for those who wish to participate in the debate. We are fully debating the principle(s) of the bill by way of a motion during second reading, which allows members to introduce and debate a motion specifically on the purpose, scope and/or principle of a bill. We intend on bringing amendments to the Bill with the intention to improve upon the purposes of the bill. We have also been asking questions during Question Period about some of the details of the Bill and are hoping during the Committee of the Whole we can have a better chance on getting some of those questions answered.
