LMYA Report

On May 11, 2013 **Jim** and I attended a meeting with representatives of the four LMYA regions. It was held at Hammond Yacht Club in Indiana, just the other side of the Skyway Bridge from Chicago. The clubhouse, built in 2000, is shared with the Hammond Marina. Amenities of the marina include a ship's store, deli, restaurant, showers and laundry, and fuel dock. A marina summer pier spot is a bit pricy at \$2,337 for a 30' boat which includes water, electric, and dock box - but even at that price, the marina is already full of boats for the season. The yacht club itself has a bar and restaurant and was where the meeting was held.

Getting more participation from yacht club delegates to the LMYA is a major issue at this time. In order for them to pass on information to clubs, it was decided that email addresses should be collected for delegates that have them. Email updates on LMYA activities could then be passed to delegates between issues of The Spreader. The Spreader will now be sent to delegates who are not sustaining LMYA members. Delegates will be encouraged to be the people who supply changes of information from their clubs. As always, delegates are encouraged to attend LMYA meetings. Currently, no club delegates are attending the regional or multi-regional meetings unless they hold LMYA offices, except for the SMYC delegate - me. Actually, that is no longer true, as I now hold the LMYA Wisconsin Region office of Purser/Yeoman. To keep LMYA an effective voice for Lake Michigan yacht clubs, more delegate participation is very much

needed. A concerted effort this year will be made to get more club delegates informed and active.

News from the regions, beginning with Illinois, is that flood damage was sustained by some yacht club buildings along the Illinois River. Also, boats were knocked off their stands and sunk because their drain plugs had been removed for winter storage. There is concern that dams on the river could be damaged due to undermining by flood water. Despite these problems, a multi-club cruise is planned in the area for early September.

Indiana had only a half inch of rain lately, water levels being seventeen inches below normal. The Army Corps of Engineers will be doing some dredging. There are clubs in the area that are considering disbanding because of lack of participation in club activities.

In the Michigan Region, there has not been much dredging yet except for commercial harbors. Small recreational boats have been out fishing but owners of larger recreational boats are not getting out yet.

In the Wisconsin Region, two event dates are set: June 21-23 for the rendezvous in Port Washington and the South Shore Yacht Club open house on July 5–7.

Reminder to all SMYC Fishermen that the Annual SMYC vs. SSYC Fish Contest (aka Fish-On-Fish-Off) will take place July 27th at SSYC. We need <u>ALL</u> boats in our fleet capable of participating

in this great event to get a crew put together. The more boats we have participate, the better our chances of fielding the best 5 boats—so even if you are a casual fisherman, don't hesitate to sign up. SSYC does a great job of putting this event on each year. We lost the traveling trophy after the 2011 contest, and can't let that happen again! As has been the case in previous years, SSYC will provide free dockage on the evening of July 26th for all SMYC members fishing or cheering on SMYC. A sign-up sheet with envelope will also be available behind the bar after June 9th. If you are going to participate in this event please sign-up ASAP so we can review the listing of boats participating on both sides. Tight Lines to all Fishermen!

Entry Fee: \$35.00 per boat.

Food: \$7.00 per person (BBQ at SSYC. Burgers, brats, etc.) **Times:** Leave the dock no earlier than 4:30am the day of the contest. Your club representative will release boats. Lines can hit water at 5:00am. All coolers

need to be checked into the SSYC Harbor Master by noon.

Rules: All Wisconsin DNR rules apply. Most notable: Only fair hooked. No Sorting of Fish. Must quit fishing when the first legal 15 fish total are caught. 9 Rods maximum, with 9 lures maximum. Prizes awarded on the following basis: 10 points per fish, 1.0 point per pound, ounces converted to 1/10 points. Weigh in will be at the SSYC (by car or boat) No Later Than 12:00 Noon (all coolers received after noon are disqualified).
