Chad Ramsey is the minister of the Gloster Street Church of Christ in Tupelo, Mississippi, where he has served since 2003. He and his wife Beverly have three children: Johnson , Anna Mae , and Jake Franklin . Chad is a graduate of Freed-Hardeman University (B.A., History), Tennessee Bible College (B.A., Bible; M.A., Christian Doctrine and Apologetics), and the University of Mississippi (M.A., Philosophy). He is currently doing further graduate work at FHU.

Prior to coming to Tupelo, Chad preached at the West Sparta church of Christ, Sparta, Tennessee. He is the author of the book, *Reasons to Believe: A Survey of Christian Evidences*, and he writes Bible class curriculum for Gospel Advocate Company. A second book, *In God's Image: A Study of the Nature of Man*, has been published by the Gospel Advocate more recently. He has a weekly article in the Tupelo Journal.

Chad is a regularly sought after speaker for gospel meetings and youth gatherings. He is a talented speaker, academically prepared and grounded in the Word. He is well thought of by the Gloster Street congregation and respected in the Tupelo area. He was selected to be one of the moderators of the *Open Forum* this past February at the Freed Hardeman Lectures. You will find that Chad's presentation will be both interesting and informative.

Sheep Without a Shepherd

By and large, Americans know so little about sheep, yet the Bible is filled with references to shepherds and their flocks. My nearly ten years of living in New Zealand allowed me to be around them. When I went to New Zealand, there were three million people living in that beautiful land and there were eighty million sheep!

I remember driving to conduct a Bible study at a residence on one of the large sheep farms (in New Zealand they were called sheep stations), and found the road blocked by a vast flock of sheep. Some of the stations in New Zealand had flocks that had over 15,000 sheep on them. There were not this many on the one where we were headed to teach the gospel, but it did not take us long to discover how "dumb" sheep are. There was no leader among them as we attempted to drive through them, so they aimlessly meandered around but never moved off the road to give us a path. Sheep will follow a shepherd and his dogs, but they are hopeless without a leader.

In Mark chapter six, Jesus saw a similar disarray, but it was not with sheep. "And Jesus, when He came out, saw a great multitude and was moved with compassion for them, because they were like sheep not having a shepherd. So He began to teach them many things" (Mark 6:34). Neither sheep nor people do well without a shepherd. They are hopelessly lost without someone to guide them.

There were shepherds in the Old Testament who needed to care for God's flock (Israel). The problem was that they received the honor of being shepherds, but they never actually did the work of a shepherd. "You eat the fat and clothe yourselves with wool, you slaughter the fatlings, but you do not feed the flock. The weak you have not strengthened nor have you healed those who were sick, nor bound up the broken, nor brought back what was driven away, nor sought when was lost, but with force and cruelty you have ruled them, so they were scattered because there was no shepherd" (Ezek. 34:2-4). God looked down and saw exactly what Jesus saw in Mark six. His sheep, His people were scattered because there were no shepherds.

What better illustration could there be about the importance of the work of elders in the church today? What a joy it is to see shepherds in our day who truly care for the sheep. They not only care for the ninetynine sheep who are doing well, but they especially focus their attention on that one sheep who has wandered away. Without shepherds, Christians struggle, for we need godly men to lead us. Thank God for those men who have hearts of compassion for those of us who are part of His flock! ~ Dan Jenkins

8 Reasons to Dress Modestly

As the proud father of two wonderful teenage daughters, I understand quite distinctly the challenging times in which we live, especially when it comes to modesty. Too many people (including Christians) are allowing our culture, our times and our peers to set the standard for us, without realizing (apparently) the damage that is being done by an immodest, "we-bare-all" way of life.

Some folks would rather that preachers just stay away from topics like modesty altogether. So, this preacher is going to do his best to keep himself away from the topic...and just let God address the matter. Here are eight Biblical reasons that Christian ladies, young women and girls need to keep their bodies modestly attired. **Modesty is commanded by God.** *"Likewise, I want women to adorn themselves with proper clothing, modestly and discreetly"* (1 Tim. 2:9). (This list could end right there!)

If modesty is commanded by God, then immodesty is condemned by God. "*As a ring of gold in a swine's snout, so is a lovely woman who lacks discretion*" (Prov. 11:22; cf. 7:10).

Modesty is commended by God. "For Adam and his wife," who "were naked" (Gen. 3:7), "the Lord God made tunics of skin, and clothed them" (Gen. 3:21).

Immodesty is a reflection of the heart. "Do not let your adornment be merely outward…rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God" (1 Pet. 3:2-5).

Immodesty is a sin, for it puts a stumbling block before men. *"It is inevitable that stumbling blocks come, but woe to him through whom they come!"* (Luke 17:1; cf. Matt. 5:28; Rom. 14:13).

Immodesty can influence younger women and girls to dress immodestly. "Let your light shine before others" (Matt. 5:16), and "...admonish the young women...to be discreet, chaste" (Tit. 2:4-5).

The "gratifying" anatomy of a woman's body is for her husband's enjoyment, not for others. "Let her breasts satisfy you [the husband] at all times" (Prov. 5:19; cf. 1 Cor. 7:1-2).

The body is "the temple of the Holy Spirit" and not the tavern of the devil. "Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you…therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Cor. 6:19-20), and "give [no] place to the devil" (Eph. 4:27). ~ David Sproule

Are You "M.I.A."?

Missing In Action" (M.I.A.). Those are three of the most fearful words that loved ones can hear during war time. "What has happened to him? Is he alright? Has he been captured? Is he injured and alone? Has he been killed? Is it simply an oversight, or a mix-up of some kind?" Fear. Worry. Concern. Panic. Memories. Prayers--constant, crying, pleading prayers!

Perhaps this is how the angels of heaven are affected when you and I are lost, or "missing in action." Since the angels rejoice, and since there is "joy in heaven over one sinner that repenteth," is it too much to speculate that there is grave distress among the angelic armies and heavenly hosts when one of us goes astray? We know *"the Holy Spirit of God"* is grieved when we err (Eph. 4:30). Surely, therefore, there is mourning among the holy angels when we wander from our place.

Are you such an one? Have you become a casualty in spiritual warfare? Have you been taken prisoner by the devil to do his will (2 Tim. 2:26)? Have you fallen asleep on duty (Eph. 5:14)?
